Editorial

The Senate Inquiry into firearms caused a fair amount of concern but it was so encouraging to see hundreds of concerned shooters write their submissions. The Inquiry had the possibility of limiting or even stopping our sport if certain individuals in one political party had had their way. Fortunately we live in a democracy so the majority of the senators came down in our favour.

Some recommendations that may pertain to pistol shooters are:

- ◆ Gun club membership data to remain a state responsibility.
- ◆ The Commonwealth should establish a formal mechanism for industry and firearm user groups to be consulted on issues relating to firearms regulation.

The amount of time and energy the Greens wasted on a cause based on

some dubious information is quite irresponsible. Fortunately those of us who made a submission brought out the real truth that gun crime has declined since 1996, illegal imports are more of a threat than guns stolen from registered shooters and banning handguns in the UK had seen a marked increase in gun-related violence—not a reduction.

There were a number of major events in recent months with ISSF state championships in Mildura and National Championships in Adelaide. And then there was the World Cup in Korea where Peter Davis officiated and made a report. Just a point to highlight; when I was putting the scores into a spreadsheet so you could appreciate our Victorian shooters efforts I noticed something. Bruce Quick beat the commonwealth gold medallist for the Rapid Fire title. Sensational. Then our team won the two major trophies for the states—the Manton Shield and the Phillip Adams trophy. Well done all.

Enjoy your shooting.

Judges Corners

I have been asked by a number of members if we are going to go down the same track as the ISSF and make Equipment Control voluntary. The short answer is no. Whilst it sounds good, and for clubs running opens it would give them more staff for the ranges, they would still need somebody there for those who wished to have their equipment checked. At the events run by the ISSF we are talking about shooters who are the elite of their country and whose equipment should be correct (more on this later). Here we deal with the seasoned shooter and those attending their first competition outside of the club they belong to. Whilst the seasoned shooter should be capable of testing their equipment the new shooter is not. If we make it mandatory for all then we are seen to be operating in a fair and equitable manner.

I did say early that the equipment of shooters attending events organised by the ISSF should be correct, well I have news for you. Having just returned from the World Cup in Changwon

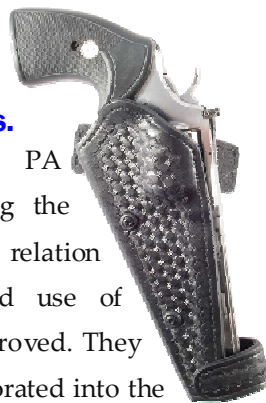
South Korea there were 14 shooters disqualified after spot checks. These were for equipment not being correct. I will say here that luckily none of those were pistol shooters, they were all rifle shooters. But let's not get too complacent as not all shooters were tested after the event.

Equipment Control in Australia is here to stay.

Important changes to the PA Holster rules.

At the recent PA Executive meeting the following rules in relation to the wear and use of holsters were approved. They have been incorporated into the PA General Regulations. These rules are to reinforce rules that have previously been in place – however please take particular note of points 2.4.2.1 and 2.4.2.7

2.4.2. The holster must be safe, serviceable and suited to the pistol/revolver being used

2.4.2.1. The holster belt must pass through belt loops on

the shooter's

clothing. If a double

belt is used the inner

belt must pass through the belt loop.

Where two belts, that are not both part of the holster rig, are used they must be

affixed by the use of keepers, and the

inner belt must pass through belt loops

on the shooter's clothing.

2.4.2.2. The holster MUST cover

the trigger when

the firearm is

holstered

2.4.2.3. When

holstered the firearm must

- Not be directed at any part of the shooter's body
- Not be directed to the rear (i.e. must not be directed up range)
- Be directed within one metre of the shooter when standing normally
- When unholstering the firearm must not be directed to the rear



2.4.2.4. Any retention device, if used to pass Equipment Control, must be used throughout the match

2.4.2.5. Holster tie-down is NOT permitted

2.4.2.6. Shoulder and cross-draw holsters are prohibited

2.4.2.7. When holstered a part of the firearm must be positioned no lower than the top edge of the belt.

2.4.2.8. The holster belt must be rigid and must be wide enough to support the holster without the holster swivelling on the belt

For the rest of this year a breach of these rules will incur a warning only, provided that the holster is safe, secure and serviceable.

After 1st January 2016 a breach of these regulations will be considered to be a holster safety violation and may incur disqualification from the event.

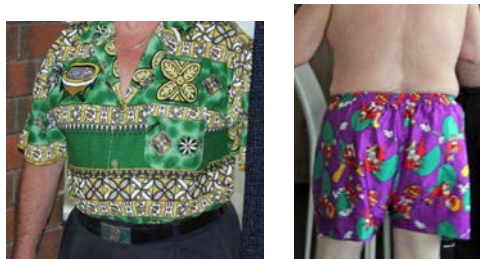

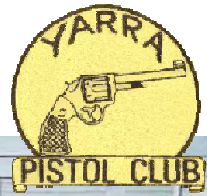
Around The Clubs continued

Yarra Pistol Club—Range Renovation

Yarra Pistol Club applied for a grant under the Shooting Sports Facilities Program Minor Funding Program 2014 and was one of the fortunate shooting clubs to secure one in the first round.

Yarra had been looking at various projects that needed to be undertaken to update its facility prior to the grant being announced and was in a position to act quickly when the funding program was opened. The successful application has enabled us to commence a major renovation program to specific areas within the club.

The major renovation was to upgrade our old 50 metre range making it a multi purpose range, one that all our members would benefit from. Renovations have commenced turning this range into a facility where we will have multiple turning target frames and the ability to not only shoot 50 metre pistol but accommodate all ISSF events,

WA1500, Service as well as IPSC and ICORE.

Initially there will be four banks of five targets installed on concrete tracks, with all air lines and power installed underground. The concrete tracks have been setup to allow for an additional two banks of targets to be installed at a later date when the range buildings have been extended.

We anticipate works to be finalised very soon and the re-opening of the new range around the Queen's birthday weekend. This will be dependant on weather conditions and final approval to the changes from Licensing Regulation Division.

Our air pistol range will also undergo

We still have a lot of hard work ahead of us, but the committee and members are happy with how the renovations are taking shape.

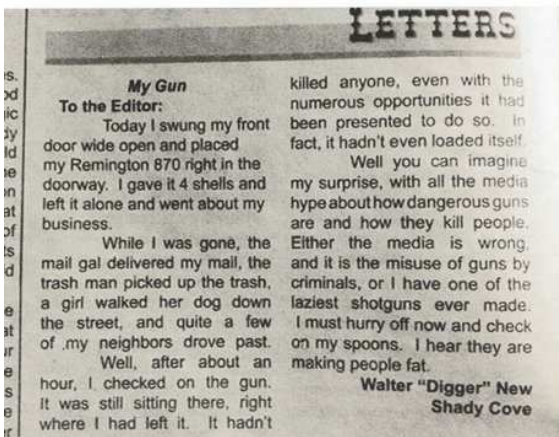
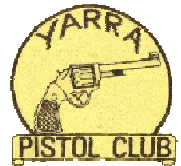

VICTORIAN 2015 ISSF STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS AT MILDURA



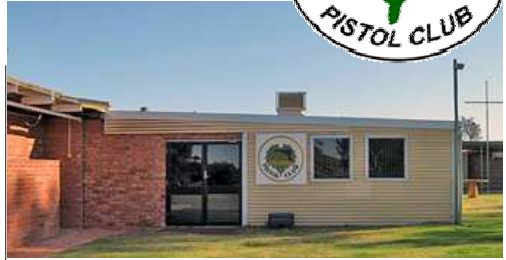
The 2015 Victorian ISSF State Championships were conducted over the Labour Day long weekend at Mildura Pistol Club.

Whilst the weather can be very hot at this time of year, fortunately competitors enjoyed very mild and pleasant conditions.

As a small club of approximately 30 members, Mildura Pistol Club made a huge effort to ensure the range operated in an efficient way. New safety walls had been installed between 2 ranges and new air rams installed on all turning targets.

Competitors who had not been to Mildura previously were impressed with 3 ranges of targets being on rails which removed the need for range staff to walk down the range for scoring and patching duties.

57 competitors from 3 states attended. Organisers were surprised with the low



number of Victorian competitors but very appreciative of the participation given by Beaconsfield Pistol Club members.

It was also a disappointment that it was not compulsory for Victorian ISSF team members to attend their own state championships. 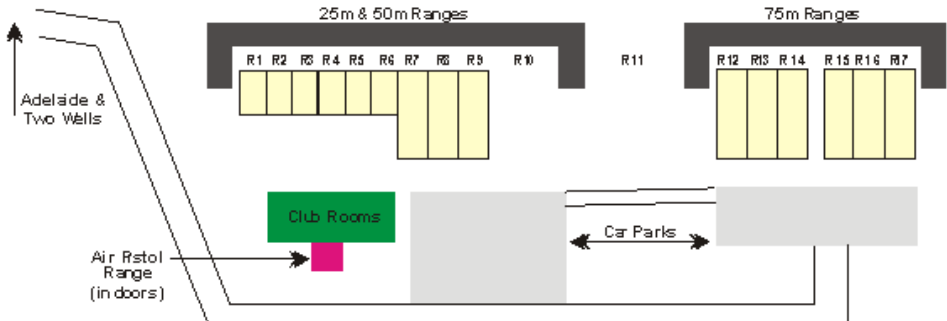
Due to its location, finding accommodation for the team was no easy task and I settled for a motel on the northern side of Adelaide.

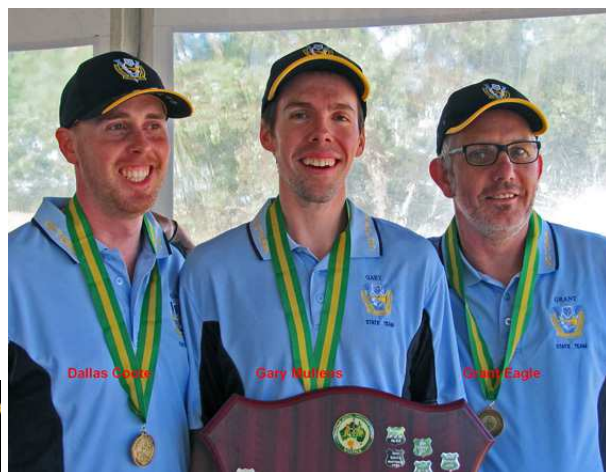
