Easy to access, just ask.

Judges Corners: Equipment Control

This issue I am going to talk about an area that as a competitor is usually the first port of call on arriving at a club for an open shoot, and that is Equipment Control (gun check).

Whilst the ISSF have made Equipment Control voluntary, in Australia we will continue to have it as we are dealing with all levels of competitor from the elite to a competitor at their first open.

Equipment Control is where a lot of competitors feel that the officers manning this area are out to make their attendance at this event a nightmare, by failing their equipment. This is not true; however, it is their role to make sure that all competitors are using equipment that complies with the ISSF regulations. This helps to make the competition fair for one and all like the grading system used in Australia, allows competitors at the same level of competency to compete against one and other.

Items that should be presented to Equipment control for checking are the

pistol and its attachments and footwear, in some circumstances eyewear will also be required to be checked.

The pistol will be checked for overall size in the box (300mm x 150mm x 50mm) for air pistols the box is (420mm x 200mm x 50mm), the sight radius (220mm for all 25m pistols), the grip and the trigger weight (500gm for Air Pistols, 1000gm for all 5.6mm(.22) calibre 25m pistols and 1000gm for Centre Fire pistols).

The following are some of the reasons why pistols fail to meet the regulations at a particular event even though they passed at an event 2 or 3 weeks earlier.

Pistols that will not go in the box even though they have in the past.

Reason: Most pistols have timber grips, timber absorbs moisture and swell, also if a grip has an adjustable palm shelf it may be in a different position.

Fix: Trim the grip down by a couple of millimetres to allow for the moisture absorption, this will not impact on the pistols performance, or yours, but will give you peace of mind that you know it will fit the box. With the palm shelf make sure that it is in the same spot every time you have the pistol checked.

Pistols that will not lift the trigger weight.

Reason: Temperature can have an effect on the sears after all they are metal. Too much oil can also be a

reason why the trigger will not hold the weight.

Fix: We all know that you need to clean and oil your pistols but don't drown the pistol in oil and you can avoid this problem. Temperature is something we cannot control but we can put measures in place to overcome this problem. Do not adjust your trigger so that it will just lift the prescribed weight, instead adjust it so there is a tolerance over the minimum weight. A suggestion, and it is just that — a suggestion, set your air pistol trigger

30gm over to 530gm, your 25m 5.6m pistols 50gms over to 1050gm and your centre fire pistols 80 to 100gms over 1000 to 1080—1100gm. The extra weight will not be noticeable but will ensure peace of mind that it will lift the weight each time.

You may wonder why spot checks are carried out from time to time and why it is usually only the trigger that is checked. Again this is to ensure that competitors equipment maintains its trigger pull throughout the event as per rule 8.4.2 (page 402 in the 2017 PA ISSF rule book). The trigger checks are done at random. The firing point number will be selected without knowing who is occupying that station.

Competitors may wonder why Equipment Control Officers may ask for pistols to be presented for the first

relay only. This is done to expedite the large number of competitors in the first relays so, as they are not delayed thus delaying the start of the event. Once the first relay is under way the pressure is off and they can check pistols for other events.

The only other thing I have to say is that all competitors are advised to hand their pistol over to the E.C. Officer in an open condition i.e.: - slide open and magazine removed, cylinder swung out or breach open. This is purely a safety issue where it can be seen readily that the pistol is not loaded.

Hope this makes your next visit to Equipment Control a pleasant one.

What does it take to be a newsletter editor?



The Victorian Pistol News (VPN) is looking for a new editor. I have done the job for 3 years and think its time to let someone else have a go. I will do it until December then its up to he new editor. If you are interested I have outlined what the job involves; what is essential and where there is allowance for creativity.

The software and computer.

A publishing software package is needed. I use Microsoft Publisher and while the previous editor used Adobe In Design, any software that produces the desired result is suitable though all the templates I created are for Publisher 2016.

Another piece of software I use constantly is Photoshop Elements - to edit all photos to ensure the best output. Other photo editing software could be used instead.

The computer I started with in the first 12 months was a 17inch laptop and it was fine. (I was also editing a club newsletter on it) When the laptop died I changed to a desktop computer with twin 27" monitors; not essential, but nice and more productive.

The magazine is laid out as A5 size. This is half a sheet of standard A4 copy paper size on its side. Text is laid out in columns because my training

and experience shows that this is the easiest way to read; short lines of text, rather than long ones. (All this has been setup and available for the new editor to takeover.)

The cover.

I redesigned the cover so each edition only requires a good picture or two of recent events. This is where it is so helpful if clubs send in photos.

The regular content.

There are some items which are included in every edition and the editor chases those who supply the material—President, Referee Council, VAPA Merchandise and Competition Controller mainly.

I introduced the buy-sell section with members' free advertising. These ads need to be kept current—nothing worse than continuing an ad for something already sold.

Results of recent competitions are also setup using MS Excel spreadsheets and then inserted into the publication.

Advertising is good for VAPA and the members. The ads show services and products available; the advertisers provide the adverts they want inserted. (Their Ads are also displayed on the

website and in the Members Handbook.)

Optional content.

While there are the regular items which replace the previous editions' content, there is still room for your creativity. I have tried to encourage clubs to provide material of what's happening at their club. This is an area a new editor could use his/her talent. Members like to know what is going on at other clubs but many clubs seem reluctant to share the news.

How long does it take to put an edition together?

The standard edition of the VPN (as it was when I took it on) would take about 8 hours. As I got creative and included all the new sections it is now about 30+ hours, so a new editor can start with the basics and develop as time allows.

Distribution & the VAPA website.

The VAPA committee of management (club delegates) decided to stop posting copies of the VPN to members due to the exorbitant cost of postage. To get around this problem we distribute via email and the VAPA website.

The completed document in Publisher is saved as a pdf file and a copy is sent to all club secretaries for distribution to their members. The other way members can access the VPN is on the VAPA website. Members login and can read the VPN on their computer/phone/pad or print it out.

The future.

We all know the world of technology is constantly changing. Where previously documents were printed they are now sent out electronically, mainly due to cost. Also, some people prefer to read on their phone rather than on paper.

I believe we can develop our VAPA website to include much of what is now produced in a magazine format. Imagine wanting to read articles on a particular subject; these would all be under relevant headings. I developed the VPN Index along those lines so that when you want information on a subject the VPN Index lists all the previous editions containing that information.

Who knows what the future holds in regards our magazine? For now it's a document either on paper or a digital version of it. The new editor has the opportunity to help whichever way it develops.

How about it?

If you have an interest in publications or graphic communication or such this may be for you. I have setup all the templates and styles so the hard work has been done, ready for the new editor to manage the content ready for distribution (which is done by the secretary.)

Lets not do anything to draw their attention to the sport. Thanks to all who contacted your local MP.

Coaching: The Benefit of Repetition

Developing good habits.

I was watching a Service Pistol match where the shooters commence using one hand for 3 shots then change hands for the next three shots. It requires control and dexterity as well as the skill to hit the target. One shooter I watched did it so well it seemed the revolver jumped from one hand to the other, and he hit the middle of the target again and again. The shooter is in the state team and I asked Brett the secret to his technique. "Work out a system that works; which hand to start in etc, then working over a soft surface practise it over and over." (the soft surface was his lounge carpeted floor in case he accidentally dropped his gun.) So his secret was finding a good technique and then practise it over and over. Repetition.

Have you watched any top sportspeople do something and made it look so easy? Like a golfer bend a ball around a tree or fire a ball at the green and get it to stop just so. It took lots of practise.



One famous golfer said "the more I practise the luckier I get."

What about in everyday life? When we drive a car, we do things so naturally that a learner wonders if they will ever 'get it'. For those who drive a manual car; do you remember the challenge of mastering the clutch and accelerator at the same time? Or mastering the 'handbrake start on a hill'? After a lot of repetitive practise it becomes second nature - so now you don't even think about it.

Those who ever completed an apprenticeship or traineeship know how to learn a task or procedure - we were shown the best method and then expected to practise it until you can do it, and master it.

I remember taking a course in typing (keyboarding)



when it wasn't fashionable like it is today. We were shown how to place our hands on the keyboard and that each key was to be pressed with a designated finger. What a challenge I didn't think I could ever master. The idea was that we were shown something that we knew worked but just seemed impossible to learn. I did master it and when I lost a finger in an accident years later it wasn't long before my brain helped me compensate and now I am back at a good speed again. The trick was practicing the proven technique over and over. Repetition. While it was boring, the result is rewarding.

I did a course years ago where we were taught the value of being organised. During that exercise an example was given of changing an old habit. The task was to reposition the waste paper basket in your office. Now mostly we toss waste in the basket without thinking as it has been

a habit. For days I tossed paper on the floor where the basket had previously been unless I deliberately



looked for it and aimed there. We learned that it normally takes the average person 14 days to break the old habit and change to the new one. The point is, if you practise something over and over it will become ingrained. It will become natural so you can do it without thinking. It better be a good technique you are practicing.

There are examples in various sports where one habit has needed to be unlearned so a new one can be learned.

In some shooting disciplines everything is done slowly and methodically so it is somewhat easier to learn a procedure than others where things go faster. In most ISSF events you have 60 seconds to load 5 rounds, then after that the 5-shot series starts. In other disciplines

loading multiple times is part of the timed series. For these matches the process of feeding rounds into the revolver cylinder at speed requires lots of practise so it becomes 'natural'. Even loading with Speedloaders.



What about the actual match? In ISSF rapid fire you need to perform the procedure of raising one arm vertically, stopping and hitting the target, moving your arm horizontally a specific distance, stopping and hitting the target then moving horizontally again and again. All in various short times. The point is that to do this properly requires practise. Correct practise of a good technique.

In matches like Service Pistol and WA1500 etc the shooter is required to draw from the holster, get into position (prone) and hit the target, change position and kneel, reload and shoot, change position and sit, reload

and shoot then stand up, reload and shoot; all on the clock. There's a lot going on there with changing positions, shooting while in those unnatural positions as well as reloading. Again, this requires a lot of practise to become reasonably good at it. But it must be practise of a proven good technique.

From experience, I know the art of pulling 5 rounds of ammunition out of my jacket pocket while on the clock in Service 25 can require practise. Once, for some reason my pocket restricted easy access and caused problems. This should have been practised over and over at home so any likely problems would be resolved.

and never planned. To reduce the chance of this happening continued practise will often identify a potential problem so it wont be such a surprise.

Have you ever seen someone not set the magazine in their auto properly so it wont function (or falls out), or not cock the hammer

or slide? The

benefits of

repetitive

practise should

involve every little step

of the process you want to do

unconsciously. One tip; when

reloading ammuntion ensure all your

rounds fit the cylinder, and cycle

properly, in the gun you plan to use.

The key to benefiting from repetitive

practise is in identifying the best

process that will work for you and



practise it over and over. Often watching the best shooters (and talking to them) helps and if there is a good coach around that's even better.

A note on safety. When practicing it's a bit hard to work without ammunition but don't use live ammunition at home. For centrefire practise make up some dummy rounds: leave out the primer (or leave the old one in) and no powder but use the normal projectile. That way you will have the right weight and shape if practicing reloading by hand or speed loaders. For rimfire I don't have a suggestion for replicating the .22 round so just be sure you never load live ammunition at home.

If you are practicing where live ammunition is required (like loading magazines and fitting it into the gun) please do it at the range as you would for a match.

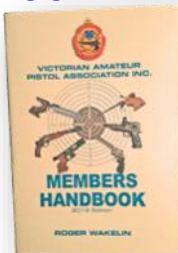

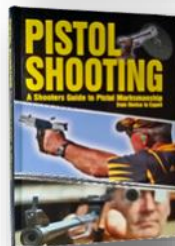
