



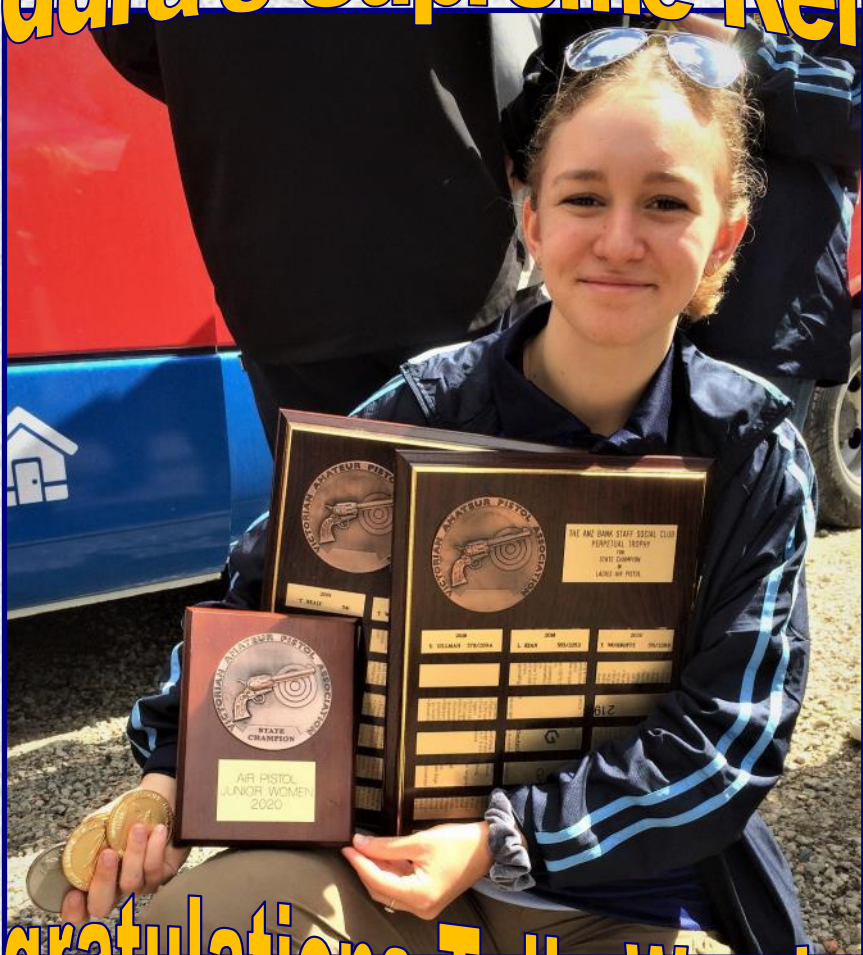

Firstly, I want to wish all our members and their families a Happy and Prosperous New Year.

At this stage, VAPA has not received word of damage to any of our country club ranges due to the horrific bushfires that swept across the eastern parts of Victoria over the summer. I am certain that these fires and, now in some parts, flooding have impacted members of our association either directly or indirectly. If there is anything VAPA can do to support people and clubs affected please contact the secretary, Roger Wakelin, at secretary@vapa.org.au.

We can all support these country areas by taking a trip for lunch, dinner or a weekend break, even more of a reason if any of these clubs are holding an open in the future.

This year we again have a pretty full-on competition calendar. Due to the World Action Match Championships in Toowoomba in October, PA has moved the Action Match Nationals forward to the 29th August. This has meant reshuffling the Postal Finals and our

Action Match State Titles, so the Postal Finals will run from the 26 July until 16 August. The Action Match State Titles on 22-23 August at Yarra and the PA A.M Nationals on 27-29 August.

I am also pleased to announce that Victoria was again nominated to run the 2021 PA/ISSF Nationals to be hosted again by the Yarra PC. At its meeting last month, PA management agreed that in the future the PA/ISSF Nationals may be split up so more clubs could hold the events and not be limited to those clubs like Yarra that can run the entire event. The VAPA executive will continue to nominate any club in Victoria willing to hold a National event.

In a first for Victoria, our State Team Manager, Cherie Blake has introduced State Team Captains to add extra support for our team members. The new team captains are Linda Ryan (ISSF Matches) and Andy Miller (PA Matches). There will also be coaches with the team at the ISSF Nationals as well as our State Titles in March, we are also looking for coaches to go with the PA and Action Match teams.

The is to follow up on the two successful State Team coaching weekends run by the coaching council.

Cherie has also organised a team dinner at the Nationals so the PA and ISSF teams can meet up and get to know each other, as in the past - one team is leaving as the other is arriving.

This is the start of a whole new year and I would like members to make a New Year's Resolution, no matter what grade or level of shooting they are in, to enter

at least 2 or 3 Opens or Nationals this year and experience your sport at its best. Yes you may not win but you will win with the experience you gain competing beside experience shooters and you will make friends along the way.

Insurance cover for VAPA Clubs & Members

I was recently asked for information on our insurances for VAPA clubs and members. I thought it best to respond in the VPN so everyone can be informed. Thanks to the Beaconsfield member for asking.

VAPA hold several policies – some for clubs, some for members.

Clubs are covered for professional indemnity and management liability, as well as public liability. Members are covered against injury as well as their guns and equipment are covered.

I have briefly summarised these policies below; for more details you can view or download the summary documents for each policy from our website. (see the note at the end regarding accessing the website 'members' section.) Our insurer is Sportcover Australia handled by Marsh Advantage Insurance. Any claims or queries can be directed to Marsh Advantage, Lauren Coburn email lauren.coburn@marshadvantage.com or the VAPA secretary.

1. Associations Liability for sporting bodies.

This policy insures VAPA clubs for Professional Indemnity and Management Liability. It also covers councils, shires, schools and government departments who may be landlords of clubs.

Policy number PMEL99/0092999

- a. It indemnifies clubs against any claim in connection with running the club up to \$2,000,000.
- b. It covers claims made against an insured officer and/or the club up to \$2,000,000

2. General & Product Liability Insurance

This policy covers VAPA, clubs, members, voluntary workers, authorised visitors, coaches, and range staff while administering firearms sports up to \$20,000,000.

Policy number PMEL99/0088611

- a. It covers the above against claims for compensation for personal injury or property damage arising from an occurrence in connection with the club's business
- b. It covers the above for legal fees and court costs
- c. It will reimburse all reasonable expenses (other than wages or loss of earnings or profit)

- a. It covers bodily injury sustained by an insured person during the scope of cover (e.g. at a shooting event) up to \$100,000. This is reduced to \$20,000 for those under 18 or over 76 years.
- b. It covers medical benefits – non-Medicare benefits and Physiotherapy benefits
- c. It covers weekly benefits; loss of income, student allowance and domestic help for non-income earners as well as other benefits
- d. The Policy does not cover injuries sustained by self infliction or whilst under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs.
- e. While this policy lists 'authorised visitors' they must comply with certain requirements;
 - They all must sign the visitors' book and remain under supervision.
 - Visiting shooters from non-VAPA or PA clubs are not covered by VAPA insurance and must sign an indemnity form before being permitted to shoot .

3. Personal Accident Insurance

This covers VAPA members.

The Insured is: VAPA (and the other state associations), clubs, members, voluntary workers, authorised visitors, coaches, range staff while in the business of administering, conducting and arranging firearms sporting events. (Other official functions include attending Committee of Management Meetings, carrying out range improvements, range maintenance or canteen duties carried out voluntarily by members, assisting at the VAPA stand at a gun show, or whilst travelling to or from any of the above.)

Policy number PMEL99/0108889

4. General Property Insurance

This policy insures VAPA members equipment. You are covered anywhere in Australia and (for 21 days a year) anywhere in the world.

Policy number PMEL99/0106026

- a. It covers members firearms and associated equipment whilst in transit, stored in a locked vehicle or building in accordance with state law or destroyed by fire or theft whilst in use at the club for unspecified firearms and equip for any one member: \$12,000
- b. Loss means loss or damage caused by or arising from an unforeseen accident including theft from a secured locked vehicle.
- c. The insurer may, at their option, repair or replace any lost or damaged property relative to market value.

Note. A recent Melbourne Club incident where the table on which members guns rested was blown over by a sudden gust of wind resulting in damage to the guns which fell to the ground; repairs were covered by the policy.

Go to www.vapa.org.au > top menu > Members > Important Documents > Insurance to find:

- Policy Coverage Summary sheets for each of these policies
- Certificate of Currency for Assoc Liability and
- Public Liability policy Certificate. This one is necessary to be shown if you are planning to hold an event where the public are involved e.g. Bunnings sausage sizzle.
- Indemnity form
- VAPA Range Incident/Injury Form.

Clubs are expected to record and report all incidents and injuries that may (now or in the future) require the insurance company getting involved with the Range Incident / Injury Form also for damage to equipment. Its a good idea to take photos of any damage to support your claims. A copy must be retained at the club with one also sent to the VAPA Secretary.

This summary is only a brief explanation and should be read in conjunction with the policy wording available on request from the secretary. Remember clubs are responsible for their own club insurance for fire, theft etc.

At the ISSF Nationals held at Yarra in 2019, our numbers were down and a lot of that was due to members believing Nationals were only for the elite of the sport and I will never win.

Well , you will win!

Why? Because even though you may not get the top prizes, you will get enjoyment out of competing shoulder to shoulder with the best shooters in the country.

You will gain knowledge and experience watching and talking to other competitors on how they stand, breath, hold, sights and trigger.

People who play tennis go to see the best in action at the Australian Open, they watch them practice and warm up and they bring that back to their clubs and see if they can improve their game, so why don't you.

If you feel you don't want to be on your own get a couple of members from your club to enter and have a lotto ticket on who shoots the best, just for a little incentive.

As a warm up to the Nationals enter a couple of club opens in your area, cuts down the cost of fuel and accommodation.

In the city, there are a large number of clubs within an hour and a half drive that regularly hold opens, just check the competition calendar in this magazine. A lot of you would spend that time in traffic or on trains getting to work each day.

Where you win the most is the lifelong friendships you make along the way, sometimes its meeting up just once a year or it's every time you go to an open, it doesn't matter. When I went to the Mid Murray Open last year I said it reminded me of holidaying at Rye during the summer when I was young. There were caravans, tents and motor homes around the range and I was told this was a great social weekend interrupted occasionally by competition shooting. Some clubs have between 5 to 10 members competing regularly at opens.

Going to opens supports our clubs, the local community (accommodation, food, fuel) and it increases the value of our sport.

If you feel like you need coaching, contact your committee and if you don't have a club coach then they can organise a coach to come out through the coaching council.

Increasing the WA1500 Load

Les Clark

VAPA has added matches for a trial period of 12-months to gauge & stimulate the interest in WA1500, with the possible inclusion in State Titles.

The 150-shot main matches are already in place, the rules allow the use of modified Revolvers and Semi-Autos under a fairly broad set of rule “limitations”. Think of your Service, Service U/R revolver, S&W competitor or even a full blown Korth Super Sport revolver. There is no power factor level for ammunition used.

The extra matches will all be shot “according to the WA1500 rule book” and can be viewed at www.wa1500.com.

60 Shot Matches

Open Match: This is a 60-shot match and allows revolvers or pistols using open or optical sights and a compensator (this the only match to allow this) but you cant have Barricade wings. Think of an Action Match gun and you’d be close. As in the Main matches there is no power factor to be met - so any ammo.

Distinguished Revolver: Also a 60-shot match with basically a “STANDARD out the box Revolver” with up to a 6” barrel, capable of chambering factory .38 Special 158 grain round nose ammunition.

The distinguished revolver match is shot using 158 grain projectiles of nearly any type “except a full wad-cutter” at a 110 power factor. Commercially available revolvers, such as S&W Model 14 – 19, 586/686 “L” frame, a GP100 Ruger or nearly any other brand that takes your fancy.

The only types that are NOT acceptable are those which would be deemed as having a clear advantage over a commercially available revolver.

These include, but not limited to, S&W Competitor and KORTH Super Sport revolver.

Distinguished Pistol: Any, commercially available, externally standard semi-auto pistol with no more than a 5” barrel is acceptable. Sights can be fixed or adjustable rear and an open front. Ammunition has a minimum 120 P.F. with no limitation on projectile shape or weight.

48 Shot Matches

Standard Revolver: This match is for a commercially available revolver with a 4" barrel that can "chamber" factory 158 grain round nose ammunition, with no external modifications, this includes the use of the factory supplied "rear sight".

The match is shot using 158 grain projectiles with a minimum 80 power factor. The projectiles used can be almost any shape as long as they are NOT a full wad-cutter.

Standard Semi-Auto Pistol: This match is for a pistol with up to a 5.5" barrel and having a FIXED rear sight. Requires ammunition to meet a 120 power factor.

Again think of such things as that CZ 75/85, Tanfoglio or Glock34 you may already have in the back of the safe. Now if you think about it a "Victorian legal barrel length" semi-auto pistol with fixed rear sight could be used in all of the above "pistol" matches.

All of these matches have their own specific rules of what can or can't be changed, all of which are covered in the 2013 edition wa1500 rule book, go to the website and read them **CAREFULLY** plus the additions made in 2015.

Great News.

At their meeting in London on 21-23 February 2020, the Commonwealth Games Federation (CGF) Executive Board, approved the Commonwealth Games India (CGI) proposal, supported by the National Rifle Association of India (NRAI), the Government of India, World Archery and the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF), to hold a Commonwealth Shooting and Archery Championships in India.

The event is scheduled to be staged in January 2022 and will be held in Chandigarh, capital of the northern Indian states of Punjab and Haryana.

The decision confirmed that Chandigarh 2022 and Birmingham 2022 will be two separately organised and funded Commonwealth Sport events.

The medal tally for the Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games will include results from the Chandigarh 2022 Commonwealth Shooting Championships.

I understand the 2022 event in India will include all the ISSF and Full-bore events contested at Gold Coast 2018.

Shooting Australia will continue to keep Member Organisations informed of further developments.

The Grading System

Neil Stewart, Competition Controller

Both VAPA and Pistol Australia have a Grading System in place to ensure that members of equal ability compete amongst each other.

Establishing Your Grade:

New shooters will establish their grade in the FIRST organised competition they compete in. This could be a weekly Club Competition, an Open Competition or higher event. The score shot in that match will determine your grade.

Breaking Grade:

A competitor will break grade when their score in any competition exceeds their current grade. This can be a weekly club match, an open competition or higher event. You only need to shoot the higher grade score once to be upgraded.

To break into the Top Grade:

Master: ISSF/PA events

High Master: WA1500 Match

Super High Master: Action Pistol

The Competition must be a VAPA sanctioned open competition, other PA

affiliated state or territory association sanctioned open, PA Nationals or an international competition, with a minimum of a Judge B in attendance.

Down Grading:

There is no self down grading!

A competitor who has not shot their grade score for the past 12 months may apply to be down graded if they must have shot a competition at least once in the preceding 12 month period.

Competitor must apply in writing to their Club Secretary/Scorer/Captain. The form is available on the VAPA website.

Club Secretary/Scorer/Captain must forward request to the VAPA Competition Controller with details of the competitors scores for the past 12 months.

VAPA Competition Controller will then check the application and if appropriate issue official downgrading approval. Competitor can only be downgraded one grade per event per 12 months

Automatic Downgrading:

In ISSF/PA matches, downgrading of Master grade shooters to the next lower grade will automatically occur where the shooter does not shoot a Master Grade score in the specific matches during the preceding 12 month period.

Grading Card:

It is the competitor's responsibility to maintain their grading card and have the correct grades marked at all times. It is also the competitor's responsibility to produce their Grading Card upon request at all VAPA Open Competitions.

Open Competition Entries:

It is the competitor's responsibility to notify the Competition Organising Secretary, if there has been a change of grade between entering a competition and competing in that competition. Where a person is not graded in a match and enters a competition, the resultant score will determine the grade.
