Gosh, who would have thought when I was drafting the editorial for the March edition that, after the nightmare summer we had, we'd have another surreal three months.

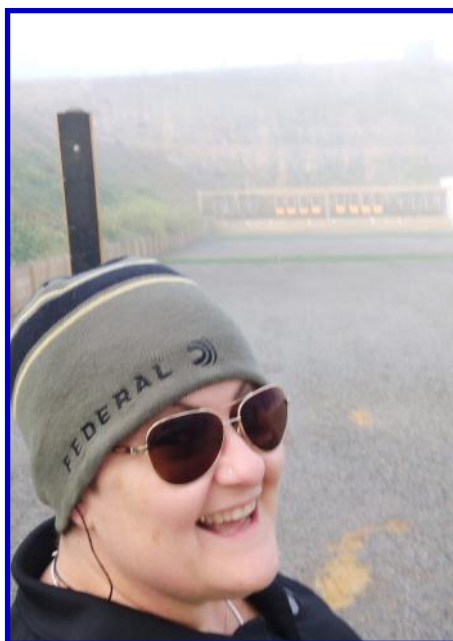

VAPA Management Matters

To all our members and their families, I hope you are safe and well, and are slowly returning to normality (whatever that means now) after lockdown.

To our country clubs who, in the past 6 to 8 months, have experienced bushfires, continuing drought and now the COVID-19 restrictions, I cannot imagine what you have gone through, so please contact the Secretary, Roger Wakelin at secretary@vapa.org.au if you need help or assistance

Pistol Australia have announced this month that all Nationals for 2020 have been cancelled. Yarra has agreed to relinquish the 2021 ISSF Nationals to allow Queensland to run them. With the number of attendees paying deposits for accommodation for this year, they would have suffered huge financial losses if the event was not held in Queensland next year.

PA has announced that Yarra will be hosting the 2021 Action Pistol Nationals and the 2022 PA/ISSF Nationals. VAPA has also put in our nomination to hold the 2022 Action Pistol Nationals.

As I write this report, Victoria are preparing to lessen some restrictions from 1 June, increasing from 10 to 20 participants then from 22 June, allowing indoor sports such as air pistol.

It is important to remember that this virus is still out there and until a vaccine or a cure is developed, the future is still uncertain. We need to continue to obey all the health rules and social distancing requirements so that we can keep on flattening the curve. That way, we can continue to enjoy our sport.

As to when we can start holding competitions—Opens included, it will be up to the clubs to decide in conjunction with guidelines issued by the Department of Health and Human Services Victoria. Hopefully we can work things out and get a few in before the years end.

During the lockdown, we received the news that two of our members won awards in the 2019 Pistol Australia Awards. Congratulations to **Cherie Blake Female, Athlete of the Year** and **Graeme Harvey, Social Media**

Contributor for producing the Victorian Junior Development Newsletter.

The PA Awards are held annually and nominations can be submitted by any person or club. Keep an eye on the PA website for the 2020 Awards as nominations open in November.

Paul Jenner is following up with LRD regarding alterations to this years' participation requirements. VAPA was advised around 8 weeks ago that LRD were discussing the matter. If there are any changes by the time we publish this edition, we will include the details.

Otherwise we will distribute to the clubs as soon as we know.

At this point in time, I am not sure about whether VAPA can hold its AGM in July, that will depend on how many restrictions have been lifted—and if we have enough lead time to notify everyone. The Secretary will be notify clubs as soon as that decision is made.

I was asked at least 6 questions on insurance since the last VPN where I outlined all our policies and how to contact the insurance broker if needed – yet these 6 people hadn't seen the article! That is a concern.

We make a big effort to supply the VPN to hopefully inform and entertain the members but it is of little use if you all don't get to see it. The process clubs agreed to was for us to use email; we send club secretaries a copy and they are to distribute to their members by email.

It seems some members aren't getting a copy. We also suggest clubs print some copies for their club rooms and VAPA will pay for printer ink and paper costs.

We understand some members aren't as switched on to computers and email as others so this should help cater for all of us. We also put a copy on the website so it can be read on line or downloaded if required.

Insurance cover for VAPA Clubs & Members

I was recently asked for information on our insurances for VAPA clubs and members. I thought it best to respond in the VPN so everyone can be informed. Thanks to the Beaconsfield member for asking.

VAPA hold several policies – some for clubs, some for members.

Clubs are covered for professional indemnity and management liability, as well as public liability. Members are covered against injury as well as their guns and equipment are covered.

I have briefly summarised these policies below; for more details you can view or download the summary documents for each policy from our website. (see the note at the end regarding accessing the website 'members' section.) Our insurer is Sportcover Australia handled by Marsh Advantage Insurance. Any claims or queries can be directed to Marsh Advantage, Lauren Coburn email lauren.coburn@marshadvantage.com or the VAPA secretary.

1. Associations Liability for sporting bodies.

This policy insures VAPA clubs for Professional Indemnity and Management Liability. It also covers councils, shires, schools and government departments who may be landlords of clubs.

Policy number PMEL99/0092999

- a. It indemnifies clubs against any claim in connection with running the club up to \$2,000,000.
- b. It covers claims made against an insured officer and/or the club up to \$2,000,000

2. General & Product Liability Insurance

This policy covers VAPA, clubs, members, voluntary workers, authorised visitors, coaches, and range staff while administering firearms sports up to \$20,000,000.

Policy number PMEL99/0088611

- a. It covers the above against claims for compensation for personal injury or property damage arising from an occurrence in connection with the club's business
- b. It covers the above for legal fees and court costs
- c. It will reimburse all reasonable expenses (other than wages or loss of earnings or profit)
- d. It covers bodily injury sustained by an insured person during the scope of cover (e.g. at a shooting event) up to \$100,000. This is reduced to \$20,000 for those under 18 or over 76 years.
- e. It covers medical benefits – non-Medicare benefits and Physiotherapy benefits

3. Personal Accident Insurance

This covers VAPA members.

The Insured is: VAPA (and the other state associations), clubs, members, voluntary workers, authorised visitors, coaches, range staff while in the business of administering, conducting and arranging firearms sporting events. (Other official functions include attending Committee of Management Meetings, carrying out range improvements, range maintenance or canteen duties carried out voluntarily by members, assisting at the VAPA stand at a gun show, or whilst travelling to or from any of the above.)

Policy number PMEL99/0108889

- c. It covers weekly benefits; loss of income, student allowance and domestic help for non-income earners as well as other benefits
- d. The Policy does not cover injuries sustained by self inflection or whilst under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs.
- e. While this policy lists 'authorised visitors' they must comply with certain requirements;
 - They all must sign the visitors' book and remain under supervision.
 - Visiting shooters from non-VAPA or PA clubs are not covered by VAPA insurance and must sign an indemnity form before being permitted to shoot .

Website

This leads me to the website. We are constantly looking for ways to provide a better website for our members – and we will continue in that quest.

At the moment the main page shows 6 menu headings: Home, Members, Competitions, Calendar, Contact Us, and Results. Any member of the public can view this page and a bit more; they can see the calendar and download entry forms but a fair amount is protected for Members Only. Have you registered for your login to the website? Just fill in the details on the bottom of the home page and we will organise it for you.

Recently we have added some documents you may find useful. Click ‘Members’ then ‘Important Documents’ to access and download the Calendar, Members Handbook, Request for Downgrading form, Meeting dates, and Insurance documents. Also, under the Members tab are the VPN Newsletters – every one since 1965. There is also a tab for *Secretaries*. This is not yet active but planned to hold material for club secretaries in the future. And there is now a tab *Junior Information* where you can access the Junior Newsletters.

I encourage you to let me know what improvements you would like to see on our website. How about finding the best club or association website (in the world) and sending me a link to it?

Presidents Report

Annual General Meeting

26th July 2019

A lot has happened during the past 12 months of my presidency.

For the first time in many years Victoria hosted the Action Match and Pistol Australia's PA & ISSF National Championships. Both were hosted by the Yarra Pistol Club and my thanks go out to the committee and members who put a lot of effort into making both a success. VAPA has now applied for both the 2020 Action Match and 2021 PA & ISSF Nationals.

In October last year the association was asked to put on a display in the highly successful Arnold Sports Festival. Due to an unforeseen accident we were unable to put on that display but we did come out with a refurbished Air Pistol Trailer and plenty of ideas for its future use. This month we were again invited to attend the 2020 festival which we have accepted.

In February Shooting Australia's Roadshow came to Victoria, the idea was to discuss all aspects of target shooting with the four target shooting bodies in Australia. The main areas of concern were how to improve membership, environmental planning and support, better communications between all bodies and development of shared services. This association will continue to work with Shooting Australia to improve our sport.

In 2016 the State Government introduced new governance guidelines; the main one was 40% female representation on all association boards by July 2019 or no further funding. The executive has worked hard on this issue over the past 2 years, always keeping in mind that the integrity of the association and the executive must be maintained. I believe we have achieved this by a review of our current constitution, adding two new appointed positions to the executive which will allow better flexibility in the future to pick people with the right skill sets to better govern this association. One of those positions was filled by Michelle Sherson as the HR Officer and Michelle has been busy in conjunction with the secretary to compile new procedures like harassment, bullying and working with children. She has also compiled new job descriptions for all positions on the executive and sub-committee positions in accordance with good governance guidelines.

All this effort paid off last month when the Minister of Sport, Martin Pakula signed off on our new initiatives. Under the 2019 – 2023 Together More Active Program this association will receive \$80,000.00 over the next 4 years to improve membership especially in junior females and under-representative groups. On behalf of the association a special thank you to our Sports Development Officer Paul Jenner who has worked tirelessly with the Sport and Recreation to help achieve this result.

The Coaching Council under the direction of Jack Holden is improving with new club coaches coming on board this year. Monthly reports are being received on the type of coaching and the time spent, thanks to Tina Markowski the secretary. This year also saw Daryl Sewell retire after a number of years as coordinator and coach of our Junior Development Squad after another successful Tri State Competition held at MISC. The coaching council have appointed Kym Sykes, Graeme Harvey and Ainsley Kelly as the new coordinators. This month saw the production of the first Victorian Junior Development Squad quarterly newsletter, a great idea as it is specifically targets junior members of our association.

With the introduction of Level 1 Range Officers and Judge C Level we have seen a renewal interest by club members to get accreditation. The Referee Council have refurbished and upgraded all their equipment including the purchase of a Lab Radar machine which is an advancement on our current Chronographs.

I stated in my acceptance speech last year that my goals were to improve communications with clubs, better communications with Sport and Recreation and start to bring standardisation to the association. Part of that was the commitment to visit as many clubs as I could and to date, I have visited 10 clubs and spoken to the members and committee to see where they are at and where the association can help them. It is a work in progress but for the first time we are compiling a database on all our clubs which will tell us how each club is set up, tenure on their land, how they are governed, their range capacities, number of RO's and coaches together with photos of the club and the ranges. This will give us a better understanding of where our clubs are at and where we need to help them.

Our Secretary Roger Wakelin is in the process of upgrading the old secretary's information documents and compiling a new secretary's manual. When completed and if I am still president, I plan to hold a seminar consisting of all club presidents and secretary's to run through the new manual and have representatives from LRD, Sport and Rec, Coaching Council, Referee Council and PA there, so clubs can get firsthand information straight from the horse's mouth so to speak.

Finally it has been a privilege to serve you as president of this association for the past 12 months. It has been a learning curve and I would not have been able to do it without the advice, knowledge and expertise of my fellow executive members, thank you for your help and support this year.

WOMEN IN SPORT: Erin Blachford

Erin Blachford may still have a few teenage years left to tick off — but she has already packed plenty into her sporting career to date.

The 16-year-old Echuca College student has tried her hand at a myriad of sports — including athletics, swimming, netball, football, softball, cross-country, cricket, soccer and more — but a pair of pursuits stand out above the rest.

Echuca Pistol Club and the Bamawm Extension Pony Club call Blachford their own, and the rising star has certainly made her mark.

“I have been a member at Echuca Pistol Club for just short of three years where I have trained and represented the club at open, state, and national level competitions where I have been on the Victorian state team for two years,” Blachford said.



She is ranked fifth in Australia in her air pistol category with a personal best of 545 out of 600 and third in Victoria in the 25 m sport pistol.

“Air pistol is an indoor precision match that is shot from a distance of 10 m from target to athlete where you aim to hit as close to the centre of a target as possible,” Blachford said.

“The firearm used in sport pistol is a .22 calibre weapon and is shot from 25 m from target to athlete.

“Now, unlike the air pistol match, this event has two stages, first the precision stage where you have five shots to shoot as close to the centre as possible in a span of five minutes.

“The next phase is the rapid-fire-duelling stage.

“This is still conducted at 25 m, but rather than the target being stationary, it turns away and faces you for three seconds and in that period you are to fire one shot then hold the

firearm at a 45-degree angle to your body for five seconds till the target is again faced and the sequence is repeated.”

Blachford followed in her pop's footsteps in joining Echuca Pistol Club, and feels female participation in all sports — not just her own — can be improved.

“The reasoning behind this was because “men-boys are stronger”.

“They have now changed the rules so both male and female competitors shoot a 60-shot match in air pistol rather than females only shooting 40.

“There are still changes that need to happen regarding the dress code that women are required to follow at shooting events that are straight-up ridiculous and are not fair in comparison to males.”

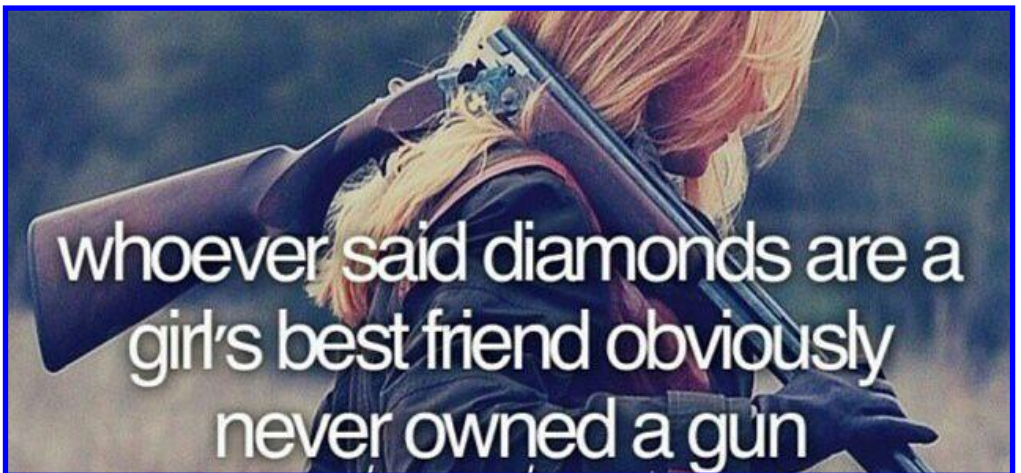
Blachford has been keeping her skills honed in isolation thanks to a new training regime, but is looking forward to getting back out there and "being able to chuck around some lead" on the range once more.

“My coach Graeme Harvey has organised a MantisX training competition online for a few of the Victorian juniors and adults to compete in while being stuck at home,” she said.

“A Mantis is a training device that is attached to your desired handgun and can be used without actually having to fire the weapon. It reads your hand movements, steadiness and trigger execution to determine the value of a shot as if it was real.

“This was started as soon as restrictions were in place and shooters were not allowed to go to ranges due to social distancing laws.”
