# VAPA Management Matters

VAPA President Bob Maddocks

What a year this has been for everyone! Over eight months of lockdown for those who live in Melbourne Metro and Mitchell Shire, however, our regional members fared no better with the Health Department classifying our ranges as indoor, and thus banning shooting in regional areas as well. Finally in mid-November, the news we have been waiting for from Sport & Rec — common sense has prevailed regarding the interpretation of the words ‘communal’ and ‘recreational’. At club level, our members are considered recreational rather than professional sports athletes so we can open again.

Another thing that came out of this lockdown was the use of Zoom meetings. After a number of false starts, I got the hang of it and the Executive have decided the majority of our executive meetings will now be via Zoom. Our AGM in October and our first COM meeting in November were also via Zoom — and well attended— we encourage more clubs to link up and participate in meetings in 2021.

Our first COM in January will be face to face as we have a number of members, held over from this year, to receive their 50-year badge.

As clubs start to reopen- all be it for a short time before Xmas - attendance numbers may still be down. As this pandemic is not over yet, there will be a number of our members reluctant to rush back until they are certain it is safe. Clubs will need to ensure they have their COVID-Safe Plans in order so members are reassured the range is safe to return to and new members will feel clubs are looking after their health and safety as well.

One thing I will stress: club committees need to make certain all members and prospective members sign in as per COVID-Safe Plans. This is to ensure that if we are contacted by the Health Department or Police, a list of people who attended can be produced for contact tracing purposes. Information regarding COVID-Safe Plans have been sent out by Roger Wakelin to all club secretaries and you can look it up on the governments websites such as

As far as restarting competitions, including state titles in 2021, the Competition Controller has rolled over this year's opens calendar into next year. Neil has also asked clubs if they would still like to run their opens or host state titles. To date, the only club who has dropped their open on the first weekend of February is Castlemaine.

Postals have also been rolled over with emails sent to clubs to check if they wanted the same teams as they put in for this year.

At this stage—pending any unexpected border closures, PA National Championships will be held as per the opens calendar.

Thanks goes to Yarra Pistol club for relinquishing the 2021 PA/ISSF Nationals to Brisbane. Although Yarra has retained the 2021 Action Match Nationals, PA has also granted Yarra the 2022 PA/ISSF Nationals.

VAPA is applying for the 2022 Action Match, 2023 PA/ISSF and 2023 Action Match Nationals.

# VAPA Management Matters

VAPA President Bob Maddocks

Results from this year's census in October show we have lost 139 members, mainly due issues with the pandemic, which was to expected.

Thankfully LRD gave permission to restart Range Safety Courses in the last week of November. Clubs are reporting they have a number of new members in the pipeline waiting to join, which is very promising.

Congratulations again to Graeme Harvey as one of four finalist in the Shooting Australia Volunteer of the Year Awards held on the 17th November. Even though he was not chosen, being nominated is a great achievement. The Junior Development Squad Newsletter is one of a kind in Australia because our juniors contribute the articles, photos and stories each quarter. That's what makes it a true newsletter for the juniors in this state. Well done.

A good thing that came out of this pandemic was the support shown by the Victorian Government to sporting associations.

Through the efforts of Paul Jenner (Sport Development Officer) and Helen Manning (Treasurer), VAPA was successful in obtaining a grant for \$200,000 to cover our expenses during the lockdown. VAPA has also applied for further funding offered through government grants.

In addition to funding VAPA received, the majority of our clubs applied for, and received, up to \$1,500 grants. The Government has again set aside a further \$4 million in improvement grants of up to \$300,000 per submission and we have a number of clubs in the process of applying for these opportunities.

This money has put VAPA on a firm financial base and will allow us to support clubs and their members reaching full potential for many years to come.

As stated in the September issue a number of clubs have used this shut down time to make small and large improvements to the ranges and facilities.

The new range at Yarra Pistol Club looks fantastic. The way this new facility has been designed means it can be used in many different ways besides just a shooting range. I look forward to visiting clubs next year and see the improvements they have made.

Lastly, I want to update you on the cross-border membership issue. In late October, we were advised by NSWAPA that NSW Firearm Registry was cancelling all lifetime range approvals to interstate clubs and all NSW licence holders in those clubs will need to join a NSW club to retain their licence.

There has been some confusion due to conflicting information coming from NSW Police Firearms Registry. From what we do know, the new rules will impact six clubs in Victoria as well as many members. This issue has now escalated to Shooting Australia and SSAA as it impacts clubs along five borders, effecting pistol, rifle and shotgun shooters.

SA, PA, VAPA, ACTPA, SSAA as well as organisations such as the National Shooting Council have all sent letters and emails to NSW Police and the Hon David Elliott MP, Minister for Police and Emergency Services (NSW).

The correspondence asks for reversal of this policy or to hold discussions addressing this issue, as it has the potential to effect up to 1000 target shooters across 5 states and territories.

As we have seen during this pandemic state and federal governments now need to sit down with residents, councils and sporting groups and work out a better solution to cross border issues than is currently in place. I will keep you informed of any developments as I get them.



And lastly, on behalf of the executive of VAPA, I wish you and your families a Very Happy Christmas and hope the New Year will bring you good health and success on the range.

## State Championships

If your club is hosting a State Championship, there have been some issues with entry forms raised by the VRC that we need to remedy. As a guideline, here are some items that **must be** included:

- the VAPA logo (it is a VAPA event, held at your club). I have copies of the logo if you need one.
- ISSF titles must include Finals for 25m Pistol Women, Air Pistol (men and women) and Rapid Fire.
- The schedule should show what day the finals are planned to be held.
- Provision for WSPS (wheelchair/ disabled athletes) on the entry form for 25m Pistol, Air Pistol and 50m Pistol. There are no grades or gender distinction for WSPS.

All entry forms for State titles need to come to the VAPA Secretary prior to being distributed or going on the website. Email [secretary@vapa.org.au](mailto:secretary@vapa.org.au)

## Money for clubs – major government grant

Clubs have been advised that there is a \$4 million grant available specifically for shooting clubs.

Key dates:

**Applications open:** Now

**Closing:** 16 February 2021

**Assessment:** February/March 2021

**Recipients announced:** April/May 2021

**Funding executed:** May 2021

**To apply:** <https://sport.vic.gov.au/grants-and-funding/our-grants/shooting-sports-facilities-program>

**Key points:**

Clubs and associations can apply for grants of up to \$300,000.

Only one application per club is permitted.

A grant for up to a total of \$300,000 must be matched on a \$5:\$1 ratio between the Government and the applicant.

For applicants to meet the 5:1 funding ratio, they need to provide a minimum of 10 per cent cash; and a minimum of 10 per cent in-kind contribution.

Supporting documents need to be submitted with the application:

- Written approvals from relevant authorities, landowners etc
- Quotes, permits (if required), environmental management plan (if you have one)
- Evidence you can pay your part
- Letter of support from VAPA (and possibly your local council)
- Your completed 'Fair Play Code' (see website for details and other requirements).

Templates will be provided for the separate reports you need to provide:

- Project Management Plan
- Project Progress Report, Project Completions Report,
- Budget Tracking Template.

## Money for clubs – major government grant cont'd

Projects can include:

- works to improve the integrity and safety of firing ranges,
- development of secure storage facilities,
- upgrades to facilities to increase participation,
- purchase of shooting equipment
- environmental protection works.

Projects to be completed within 24months (delays need to be approved). If you cant complete the project you need to return the grant funds.

## Presidents Report

### Annual General Meeting

9<sup>th</sup> October 2020

If you were looking for inspiration to write a script for a new disaster movie, you need to go no further than what has happened in Victoria over the past 15 months. We have seen droughts, floods, devastating bushfires, hailstorms and now the Covid 19 virus. Nearly all our clubs have been shut since April, and it may not be until late October that we will see clubs slowly start to reopen. Even though we are all waiting to get going again, the health and safety of our members is paramount, and all the clubs and the association will do what is required to achieve that.

The past 15 months can be seen in two halves, up till March the Association enjoyed success on and off the range. Our Action Match Team won 3 out of the four trophy's with Mark and Cherie Blake winning four National Championship Awards as well as being named on the Australian National Team. The Metallic Silhouette Team also did well with Michael Arden winning 2 Championship awards and Lachlan Moore the Junior Championship award. Cherie Blake has settled into the role of State Team Manager and new changes have been greeted favourably by team members and they are our new State Team uniforms with the big VAPA logo on the back and the V in the front., followed by the reintroducing of Team Captains where required to add support to the team members and team manager. The executive also agreed to sending a coach with the State Team as added support and to gain experience.

Between August 2019 and March 2020, we were able to complete the Action Match, WA 1500, Service Match, Black Powder and the ISSF State titles. In September last year we were also able to send 8 members to the World WA1500 Championships held at Hill Top in NSW where they gained a lot of valuable knowledge and experience for the future. The lockdowns caused the cancelation of all major events including the World Action Match Championships this year. We are all praying that we can at least get back to Covid normal next year and run our opens, state titles and Nationals.

The Coaching Council continued to grow with new coaches coming on board and for the first time in 17 years, Jack Holden and his team held two coaching weekends for our State Team members. A lot was achieved and members were pleased with the results including members of our Metallic Silhouette team who have never had coaching as a group before, more are planned for next year.

Our juniors guided by Ainsley Kelly, Kym Sykes and Graeme Harvey have achieved some great results this year. None more so than at the ISSF State Titles in March where Talia Woodroffe and Seth Birch took away 4 Titles with Talia also winning the Women's 10m Air Pistol final with a number of juniors doing PB's. The juniors are kept well informed of events and coaching information through the Victorian Junior Development Squad Newsletter which Graeme Harvey is the editor. It is full of stories, scores, articles written by the juniors and up an coming events.

Changes to the Referee Council rules has seen a number of trainee Judge C's come on board including myself. There has also been an increase in Black Powder RO's and Level 1 Range Officers Hopefully this will encourage more members to have a go as without Range Officers

and Judges we cannot hold competitions. Since August the council have been upgrading all their kits and purchased a LabRada to help with Cronographing.

Congratulations are also extended to a number of our members who received awards and appointments from PA during the year, Cherie Blake was named 2019 Female Athlete of the Year in recognition of winning the 2019 Bianci Cup Female Championship and Graeme Harvey was named Social Media Contributor of the Year for the Victorian, Junior Development Squad Newsletter and in August PA appointed Geoff Horton the 2021 Action Pistol National Team Manager.

Due to the lockdowns and boarder closures all opens and nationals have been cancelled for this year as of April, thank you to the Yarra Pistol Club for relinquishing the 2021 PA/ISSF Nationals so Brisbane can hold them and therefore not loose deposits already paid for this year. Yarra still has the 2021 Action Pistol Nationals and also the 2022 PA/ISSF Nationals, hopefully all of Australia will be in Covid normal so these events can proceed.

It was good to hear from LRD that participation attendances were dropped for 2020 but clubs please remember you are still required to submit a report for 2020. The secretary has sent out LRD's requirements for this report as it is still a requirement under the Act.

Over the past few months, I have contacted a number of our country clubs to see how they are holding up and it has been great to here that except for the frustration of lockdown they are OK. One may need assistance repairing bushfire damage to fencing, others would like more information and assistance in just how to run a club and meetings as well as supporting clubs where we can when they can hold opens etc. It has been pleasing to hear clubs have been using this down time to refurbish and upgrade their clubs and ranges, with Mildura building a new Air Pistol Range, Yackandandah also building an Air pistol range along with a new club house, Beaconsfield has installed a new kitchen and Yarra has the biggest project building a new range.

The one good thing that has come out of this lockdown for the association is the Victorian Governments Covid support grants to sporting clubs, Paul Jenner successfully applied for a major grant and last month I signed off on the six figure agreement. I will let Paul announce the exact amount in his report. This money will set up our association for many years to come and enable us to fully support our members, as to where and how it is spent will be discussed in the ensuring months as we will not receive all the funds until December this year.

To all of our members your health and wellbeing are our main concern in these unprecedented times, please do not hesitate to contact your local club or the association if you need help or support to get you through. Lastly thank you to my executive for their help and support this year it has been greatly appreciated.

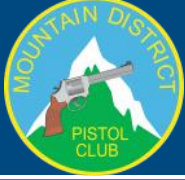

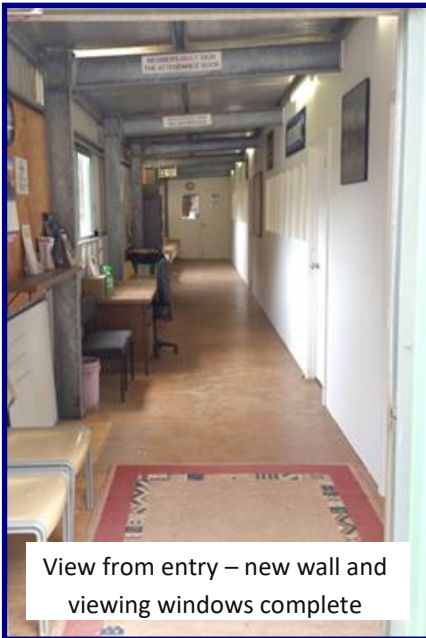

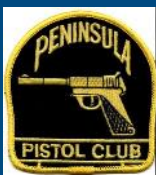

# Around the Clubs: Peninsula

In what can only be described as one of the worst days of my life, in the early hours of the morning in 2015, we received a phone call from the fire brigade that the Peninsula Pistol Clubhouse was on fire.

In the next few days, the council (who manage the site) cleared the rubble including some buildings not actually fire damaged. They also provided temporary buildings on site to use as a small clubhouse storage space and a toilet block.

The council also provided a small grant, which was used to draw up plans for a replacement Clubhouse. The plans were elaborate and it came down to the price, at over \$1.5 Million, we knew it was way beyond the means of a pistol club.

That's when the club decided it would be possible to build a self-funded clubhouse by utilising local talent and voluntary labour.

In the planning process, it became apparent that the architect's plans would not have been approved due to the height of the water table, plus the new requirements to meet the bushfire prevention measures.

We were not very successful in obtaining financing largely due to the fact that it was a replacement. Progress was at times very slow as we had to raise the funds before materials could be purchased. The solution was to build a clubhouse 3 meters above ground; the suggestion was then made to use the space underneath as an air pistol range.

Finally in October this year, the certificate of occupation was issued.

It has been a mighty effort by the whole club, working bees have been frequent and lengthy. Our President, Owen Davies has been an absolute champion - a mixture of Isambard Kingdom Brunel and Attila the Hun.

We are looking forward to using our new Clubhouse and Air Pistol range now that restrictions are lifting.

# LRD Update: NORI & Safety Courses

**Roger has had many inquiries about NORI's and safety courses.**

The Victoria Police website, checked again late November, indicates that NORI's can be used.

*"Yes, NORI's can resume.*

*Please remember that during shoots, immediate supervision is needed.*

*This means an instructor will need to be closer than 1.5m, therefore, masks will need to be worn by all participants."*

Please note that LRD won't be running any safety courses.

*"As the current pandemic continues to fluctuate across Victoria, the Licensing and Regulation Division (LRD) continue to prioritise the health and safety of the firearms industry. Therefore, in the interest of public safety, we have made the decision to cease all firearm safety courses until further notice."*

**VAPA has interpreted this advice to mean that if a NORI's is permitted then club safety courses can also recommence.**

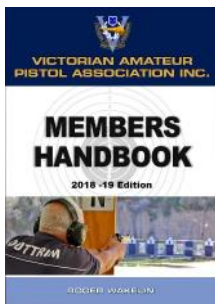

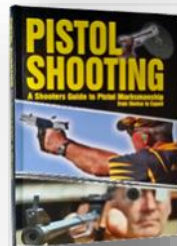
