Editorial

VPN Editor Cath Leask

So, I sold my guns. This has been a decision 2 years in the making, maybe even 3. I have struggled more and more to get to the range since the first of the COVID years. Don't get me wrong, the in-the-moment, mantric flow of the firing cycle—stance, breath, grip, sights, breath, target and beyond, aim, breath, squееeeze, breath, it is almost meditational—and so beneficial to my mental health.

And there's those two little words. Mental health. It captures such a wide landscape of definitions and interpretations. The narrative around "mental health" is often negative, and with the misconception from non-shooters and the blanket interpretation from regulators (not having a go!), those two words are two of the most feared in the shooting community. The fear of even uttering words like "anxiety", "struggling", "stress" strikes fear in the hardest of hearts.

I'm gonna say it here, shooting got me through some very tough times.

I am a survivor of firearms violence. I'm not going into details here, but I will say, when the proverbial is pointed at you, your life does flash before your eyes. There is that feeling of finality. This is it.

I never thought for a second that my life would be so firearms involved. As a Customs officer, I undertook the identification and safe-handling course in 2002, around the time when firearms legislation around the country changed due to the Monash shootings. This brought changes to barrel length, mag capacity and calibre restrictions in handguns. This change meant Customs had regained the responsibility for safety testing of imported firearms from the AFP. This meant my own anxiety was peaking. It was a different time, and different standards applied. I'm not even sure how I passed my assessment, but I must of done something right because in June 2003, I found myself in Canberra (I was living in Brisbane at the time) working 15 hour days to gain my firearms instructor's certification.

Yep, I was gonna teach this stuff to other Customs officers! I guess they saw something in me, and I am so grateful. As I said, my involvement in firearms career wise and as a shooter got my through some tough times.

From running the Customs armoury to developing and implementing policy and training programs in firearms identification, classification and safe-handling across Australia. I co-drafted the Customs firearms “bible”, regs changes and fact sheets. I was team leader of the firearms permits and dealers teams in LRD—and a stint leading the firearms licensing teams too! I worked in a firearms advisory capacity to the Member for Eastern Victoria in the Legislative Council—where I wrote the instructions that changed the advertising laws in Victoria (even though it’s not my name on it!!). I even had a crack at changing

silencer legislation ... (I wrote the best instructions the Clerk of the Office of Parliamentary Council had ever seen!).

Along side all of this, I met some amazing people who became my friends. One of those people introduced me to target shooting (handgun) in the mid-00’s. Dick Haines from Gold Coast Shooters Supplies. I met him in 2001 whilst I was on the front counter of the Post (Customs) in Brisbane. From there, I joined a club, found my “crew” with the Australia Police and Services Comp, became a recreational instructor for longarms and handguns(I was a VicPol instructor too!), won a few medals, sat on various club committees, saved a club from being shutdown—twice, and the VAPA news editor since March 2018.

It was never going to be an easy decision.

So, why sell your guns? I hear you say (and thanks if you're still reading!!). I have spent years promoting the sport, motivating shooters, running events, instructing and mentoring and I have been a huge advocate for compliance, sharing my vast legislative knowledge. And it has never been lost on me how lucky we are that pistol shooting is a legal and readily available sport to participate in.

Sadly, I have seen accepted behaviours from people in the sport—outrageous displays of entitlement, abuse of power and outright bullying. The bullying far more prevalent, I've been both witness and subjected to, in firearms related work roles and in the sport. I ran from LRD due to bullying from a civilian manager and I resigned from a gun club committee role due to horrendous bullying.

Heck, I'm no more special than the next shooter, and I don't expect special treatment but to be stanching on the firing line, bailed up and prevented from leaving the range by someone who was often angry, even volatile and a liar. With the follow up complaint

ignored, it really did send a strong message of what is acceptable in my current club. **The standard you walk past is the standard you accept.**

And that last one, that was the event that broke me. I spent the last couple of years trying to convince myself otherwise. I don't feel safe around people like that. And this person has firearms! "You can't let one person ruin it for you" I hear you say. But the lack of action from the club ... and I've run out of fight.

But you know what, I walk away with some of the **best memories** of my life, and some next level healing. Ironically, it was my firearms career and my target shooting experience that helped me recover from the trauma of years ago.

I have witnessed **superb** shooting, **inspirational** instructors and **motivators, camaraderie, connection** and **cheerleading**. Pistol shooting has given me some of my best friends, my forever friends. I have cried, celebrated and laughed until my sides hurt. Best still, my guns are staying "in the family", with two people near and dear to me purchasing my "babies".

By no means is my editorial meant to upset or point fingers. It is simply a reflection of my time in the sport.

One of my favourite quotes, *you're never too important to be kind to people* sums it up perfect.

If you're still reading, thank you. I hope that your time in the sport is filled with connection, positivity, fun, healing—and great learning and application. You have a marvellous team here at VAPA. Champions.

The dedication, professionalism and effort that the members on the VAPA

committee conducts themselves with is the best I've ever seen. If you're looking for a role model. Here you have them. Top shelf. And nice people to boot.

It probably means that the time to retire from this role will come soon, so if VPN editor is something you would love to tackle, reach out. It really is a rewarding, heartwarming and informative job!

VAPA Management Matters

VAPA President Bob Maddocks

It has been another hectic 3 months since the June VPN, Sharon Reynolds announcement of an Order of Australia Medal in the first King's Birthday Awards, Commonwealth Games zoom meetings (and then cancellation), VAPA AGM, Victoria's turn to host the Tri State competition, the start of the VAPA Postal Finals the Action Match State Titles and finally our members competing in World Cups around the globe.

I can think of no one better to receive an Order of Australia Medal for service to this sport than Sharon Reynolds. As the President of VAPA, Director of the Referee Council, International Judge and Jury member and representing Australia as a member of the Pistol Committee at ISSF and Secretary of the Oceania Shooting Federation, her knowledge and dedication to our sport is recognised both here and internationally, Sharon has always been ready to give help, support and advice when needed and I can vouch for that.

Congratulations Sharon, well done.

Last month saw Talia Woodroffe, for the first time; represent Australia in the 10m Air Pistol Women and 25m Pistol Women at the ISSF World Championship Juniors in Changwon, Korea. Talia was accompanied by her coach, Les Moncrieff, and members of her family. It was a great learning curve for her and her coach and **we wish Talia well in the future.**

Two of our international representatives, Elena Galiabovitch and Sergei Evglevski, have competed in the ISSF World Championships in Baku, Azerbaijan. Elena came so close to the finals of the 25m Pistol Women and 10m Air Pistol Women—missing by 6 points and 8 points, respectively. Sergei almost making the finals of Rapid Fire, needing 1 point and 4x's. There is less than one year to go to the Paris Olympics and **we wish them all the best in achieving team selection.**

The bad news is the cancellation of the 2026 Commonwealth Games by the Victorian Government, dashing the hopes of athletes opportunity to compete in front of a home crowd.

It also put a stop (for now) to shooting coming back to the Commonwealth Games. The other disappointing fact is there was a strong possibility that VAPA would have benefited after the games, with the relocation of part of the Air Pistol/Rifle complex.

VAPA is still in talks with Sport and Recreation regarding shooting grants etc, so if there is any funding available in the wrap up of the games, we will do our best for all our clubs.

Over the long weekend in June, Yackandandah hosted the Tri-State Competition. 19 juniors and chaperones from Victoria, NSW and South Australia came together for a weekend of competition, coaching and bonding, with a lot of fun thrown in.

With the newly constructed club house, there was plenty of room for everyone to bunk down, keeping the cold out with the wood heated running day and night. NSW won both the Air Pistol and 25m Pistol competitions. Some very good scores were shot by some very promising juniors.

Congratulations to the members at Yackandandah and, especially Marty Jones, for putting on the event and

cooking up a storm for breakfast, lunch and dinner, no one went home hungry. The only drawback was it was very cold in the mornings.

The VAPA AGM was held was held at the Oakleigh Pistol Club in July with a good number of members participating via zoom. Thank you for re-electing me for another term, it is always an honour to represent this great organisation, Michelle Sherson was re-elected as 2nd Vice President and Helen Manning was also re-elected as Treasurer.

Karen Probst has stood down from her role as Publicity Officer due to work commitments; Karen has filled one of the appointed positions on the executive since September 2019.

I take this opportunity to thank Karen for her work on the Executive and especially as a sounding board when it came to legal advice.

As of September 2023 our current State Team Manager, Cherie Blake will fill this position as Liaison Officer for the State Team and Coaching Council, Cherie is the perfect fit for this role.

The next major events on the calendar, the Postal Finals starting at the beginning of August with ISSF were hosted by MISC on the 5th and 6th. Congratulations to MISC and Paul Eskaf for organising the event.

MISC came out on top claiming first place in 50m Pistol, 25m Standard Pistol, Air Pistol Men and Centre Fire, with Beaconsfield taking out 25m Pistol Women and 10m Air Pistol Women and Yarra taking out Rapid Fire. Highlight of the weekend was Sergei shooting a 586 24x in Rapid Fire, which was a good warmup for the World Championships in Azerbaijan. Note: if he had shot the same score in the World Cup in Buka in August, he would have been place equal 2nd in qualifying.

Next, it was Outtrim's turn to host the Service and WA 1500 finals. Although very cold, the weather was mainly fine. Outtrim took out the WA1500 trophies, followed by Mountain District then Yarra. In Service, the winners were Mountain District followed by Outtrim then Warragul Drouin. Thank you to Andy Miller and members of

Outtrim, especially the ladies in catering, for a great weekend.

The last two finals to be held are at Geelong where I will catch up with the Prac and ICORE members for their Finals and Bendigo for the Black Powder finals.

Yarra Pistol Club hosted the Action Match State Titles on the 19th and 20th August. Check out pages 16 and 17 for photos. Congratulations to Geoff Horton and the members of Yarra for hosting the event and providing lunch on both days.

Over the next few months we have the ISSF Grand Prix at MISC. I will be a judge for the first time where every event will be shot on electronic targets, this will be a learning curve for me, as I have only done Air Pistol and 50m Pistol. This will be followed by our last two State Titles for the year being Black Powder at Bendigo and Service State Titles at Mildura.

On the coaching scene, VAPA has again invited Rob Vadasz back to Victoria to host a number of coaching events, this time we have singled out specific days for WA1500 and a day for coaches to learn his methods for coaching.

It will be held at the Yarra at the end of October.

Last month, both Paul Jenner and I attended a meeting called by Pistol Australia for all associations to hear the results of the 3-months Coaching Pathways review. Over 200 surveys were received and 150 interviews with coaches, national team members and current and former Olympians to determine the future direction for PA to train more coaches, national and international athletes and provide a pathway from club level, through state level, then national level before being passed onto Shooting Australia for international competitions. Still more work to be done but change is coming and it looks good for the future of our sport.

At the last Firearms Consultative Committee and Firearms Users Group meetings, VAPA again brought up the shortage of supply in primers and powder and that clubs are reducing matches to 30-shot events to conserve ammunition. There is a proposal sent to all relevant clubs regarding how we can conserve ammunition with the WA1500 matches, especially in next

year's Postal Competition.

This will be discussed at the September COM meeting. LRD have advised they are undertaking a full review of all licenced gun dealers and ranges, which they hope to finish in the first quarter of next year. More of an audit, the focus is to ensure dealers have alarms and security on site, and where dealers are conducting longarm safety courses, they hold public liability insurance.

For ranges they will be concentrating on storage facilities for firearms and ammunition. They are concerned about the increase in theft due to lack of safe keeping and ignorance of the law, one person had a rifle stolen from his house, after he borrowed it from a relative, wrapped it in a blanket and stored it under his bed. It is a timely reminder for everyone that to own a firearm in this state, it is a privilege not a right and we all need to remember the rules under which we need to retain our licences and firearms.

As I have visited clubs over the past month and had talks with members and officials, it has become clear we urgently need more range officers, judges and coaches in order for our sport to survive in the future.

Melbourne International Shooting Club

It is with great sadness that we report on the passing of Melbourne International Shooting Club life member and friend, Des Boseley who passed away on 5 July 2023 after a short illness. Des loved shooting and participated at the club multiple times each week except when he was away travelling.

Des joined the Melbourne Pistol Club, as it was then known, on 2 October 1967 and remained an active member for all 56 years of his membership. He was one of the earliest members of the VAPA with a member number of 99 – a score we would all be happy with for a 10-shot string. He received his 50-Year VAPA medallion in 2017.

Des and his wife Lesley (also a MISC life member) were stalwarts at MISC, participating in many club activities. During his time at the club, Des served on various committees holding the positions of President, Secretary, Club Captain, Club Open organiser and VAPA delegate. Des was a regular participant at Open shoots around the country for many years.



In the early days of the development of MISC at the Todd Road site, he was instrumental in the construction of the ranges spending every weekend for a two-year period, assisting with building the clubroom and the 25m ranges so that shooting could commence on the site.

His little car was used to drag building materials into place. However, that was not sustainable so Des donated a Massey Ferguson tractor which was used to assist with construction of the 50m ranges and was later used to help with grass cutting, car park repair and a myriad of other activities.

Des and Lesley

Des was ably assisted by Lesley who joked that for a while MISC was Des' second wife and if she wanted to see Des, she had to join him at the club.

In his early years, Des was a passionate cyclist and he also enjoyed model aircraft building. He loved to tinker in his shed with various projects. He also loved to fix things at the club and was often seen on a ladder replacing a light, or a bit of guttering or some other thing that needed doing at the club. He was a man of few words who loved his family and travelling, but shooting was his passion.

Two of Des and Lesley's children – Claire and Cheryl, also took up shooting and were members for a time at MISC.

An engineer by training, during his career Des worked at the SEC for a while before taking a position at the Ammunition Factory in Maribyrnong. He lived for almost his whole married life at the house in McKenna St, Avondale Heights.



His second home was at MISC in Port Melbourne where he spent many hours shooting, working on various projects and chatting with friends at the club.

Des will be missed by all of us who knew him.

This years State Championships included production optics (another great opportunity to cross train if you've added this division into your 1500 repertoire). Craig Ginger (NSW) won this division with Luke Hurst (ACT) runner up, and Steve Sutton (NSW) third.

Craig Ginger also won Metallic Division with Steve Sutton second and Leon Ovens SA third.

WA & Service Open 2 July 2023



Australia's team of 9 junior athletes has arrived home after travelling to Changwon, Korea to compete in the 2023 Junior World Championships in some very warm and humid conditions.

Attending her first international competition, Talia Woodroffe embraced the learning opportunity through competing against the best junior athletes from other countries. "It was a good experience. It has been a lot of fun while gaining international experience in a different kind of environment."

Woodroffe competed in Junior Women's 10m Air and 25m Pistol, finishing 60th (532) and 46th (538), respectively. She was joined in Changwon by her coach, Les Moncrieff, and an Aussie cheer squad that included her brother and grandparents.

Our Junior Shotgun team of Molly Bretag, Marco Corbo, Breanna Collins, Kiara Dean, William Freni-Lizzi, Lucas Furlan, Renae Jones and Ollie Zielezna, competed in the Women's and Men's Trap event, with some pairing up for the Trap Mixed Team event.

Competing over three days of qualification in the individual events, our trap athletes returned mixed results as they acclimatised to the tough weather conditions, with some experiencing equipment challenges.

Accompanying the team as a support coach, Deserie Baynes says "one of the biggest challenges faced by the athletes was adjusting to the change in weather conditions in Changwon compared to the extreme cold that we left behind in Australia. It was extremely hot with in excess of 80% humidity and then there were sudden downpours."

Of her time with the team in Changwon, Shotgun National Talent Coach Renae Birgan says "It was a great experience. The team all did so well and in particular when challenges presented themselves. They will each take the lessons and experience gained from this competition to make them stronger competitors down the track. We have some unbelievable future talent."

In the Women's Trap event, Molly Bretag shot a qualification score of 111 out of 125 targets, qualifying in second place and securing a spot in the final. Molly went on to finish 4th in the final with a score of 28 out of 35 targets. Now having returned to her hometown in Pompoota in South Australia, Molly reflects, "I really enjoyed the whole experience at my second Junior World Championships. I tried to not set any expectations, but I was ecstatic to make my first international final after shooting consistently. Finishing in 4th place was bittersweet but I am so happy, and the experience gained is so valuable." Of her preparation leading into and during the Championships, Molly says, "my opportunity to compete in Changwon would not have been possible without the support of my parents and my personal Coach Craig Bentley, as well as the amazing contribution from the support coaches in Changwon, Renae Birgan and Deserie Baynes."

Also competing in the Women's Trap event, Collins shot 106 out of 125 to finish in 13th place, Dean 104 to finish 16th and Jones 95 to finish 25th.

The Women's Trap Team event saw Australia finish in 5th place with a combined score of 310 out of 375 from Bretag, Dean and Jones.

In the Men's Trap event, Corbo shot a qualifying score of 116 out of 125 to finish in 12th place, Freni-Lizzi 114 to finish 15th, and in their first international ISSF competition, Furlan and Zielezna 106 out of 125 to finish 33rd and 35th respectively. In the Men's Trap Team event, Corbo, Freni-Lizzi and Furlan shot a combined score of 336 out of 375 to finish in 5th place.

Following the individual competition, Corbo and Bretag, and Freni-Lizzi and Dean paired up for the Mixed Teams competition, scoring 132/150 to place 8th and 129/150 to place 10th, respectively.

Shooting Australia is incredibly proud of the Junior Team for their achievements in Changwon. Thank you to the staff that supported the athletes leading into, and during competition, as they continue to develop their skills and performances. We look forward to what the next 9 years will bring as we prepare for a home Brisbane 2032 Olympics.

Summary of Decisions

SUMMARY OF DECISIONS TAKEN AT THE PISTOL AUSTRALIA EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING HELD SYDNEY 30 JULY 2023

- Confirmed the decision to provide funds for Pistol Australia athletes in the Shooting Australia Pathways Squad for Shooting Australia 2023 Tier One events. *RATIONALE: To support unfunded athletes in the new Shooting Australia squad.*
- Provide funds to support the ISSF Pistol B team competing at the 2023 Oceania Championships, Brisbane. *RATIONALE: To support unfunded athletes in the ISSF B team.*
- Changed as of 1 January 2024 the age for juniors to 18 and under allowing the athlete to compete as a junior until 31 December in the year the athlete turns 18. The change will apply at all PA, State and Territory and Open competitions. *RATIONALE: To make the junior age group more competitive and fairer by reducing the age group from 10 years (12 to 21) to 7 years (12 to 18).*
- Introduced as of 1 January 2024 a Youth category for athletes who are too old for the Junior category but are still under 21 years of age. Athletes in the Youth category will be allowed to compete until 31 December in the year they turn 21. For clarity athletes in the Junior category will not be allowed to compete in the Youth category. Matches in the Youth category will be the same as those in the Junior category. The Youth category rule will apply at all PA, State and Territory and Open competitions and will be reviewed in 2026. *RATIONALE: To ensure the athletes who were Juniors under the previous rule have a clear pathway to the senior ranks during the transition to the new Junior age category.*
- Approved the sending of a 4 person Pistol Australia Development (not National) team to the 2023 Oceania Metallic Silhouette Championships in New Zealand. The team will consist of three athletes and one coach. *RATIONALE: To support the Metallic Silhouette Oceania Championships as well as providing a pathway event opportunity for the Development squad.*
- Approved the combining of the Metallic Silhouette Small Bore/Field Pistol and Big Bore National Championships into one event from 2024. *RATIONALE: To bring Metallic Silhouette in line with all other discipline National Championships.*
- Clarified that States and Territories may enter more than one team at the 2023 Pistol Australia Action Pistol National Championships. *RATIONALE: To allow States and Territories to send athletes to the team events now that the rules have reduced teams to two persons.*
- Approved changes to the 2024 WA1500 National Team Selection Policy to include an Optical team. *RATIONALE: To adopt the new international category.*



Pistol Australia

Summary of Decisions

- Requested the NRC Director to review the rules for Action Pistol that are now being used by CMP and NRA. *RATIONALE: To examine the changes made by CMP after the transition of some matches from NRA to CMP.*
- Approved the following rule changes:
 1. For all ISSF 25m matches there will be 2 minutes set up time prior to the 3-minute preparation time for PA ISSF National Championships and for Shooting Australia selection events the ISSF rules will apply.
 2. In 10m and 50m matches the set-up time will be as per ISSF rules.
 3. Pistol Australia has adopted the ISSF rules for finals for electronic targets.
 4. Pistol Australia does not adopt rule 6.12.6.2g
 5. Malfunctions in 25m Pistol Events – ISSF Rule a) If a shot has not been fired due to a malfunction, and if the athlete wishes to claim a malfunction, he must hold his pistol pointing down range and must retain his grip. Only the tip of the barrel may rest on the bench, if the magazine is not of the type that is loaded from the barrel end, but the magazine must be clearly not touching the bench or hand and immediately inform a Range Officer by raising his free hand. He must not disturb other athletes. Approved that we continue to have competitors hold the gun off the bench BUT not penalise them if they rest the tip of the barrel only on the bench.
 6. Rule 6.2.5 Hearing Protection - ISSF All athletes, range officials and other persons in the immediate vicinity of the 25m, 50m and 300m firing lines and all Shotgun ranges must wear ear plugs, ear muffs, or similar ear protection. Notices must be prominently displayed and hearing protection must be available for all persons in the range areas. Hearing protection incorporating any type of sound-enhancing or receiving devices may not be worn by athletes or coaches on the FOP. Competition officials may wear sound-enhancing hearing protection devices or other communication devices on the FOP. Hearing impaired athletes may wear sound-enhancing devices with the approval of the Jury. At PA supervised competitions hearing protection incorporating any type of sound-enhancing device may be worn by athletes, coaches and officials on the FOP. It is approved that this Pistol Australia Rule on hearing protection continue.
 7. Rule 6.7.4.4 – ISSF Mobile phones or other hand-held communication devices (i.e. tablets, etc.), electronic devices or wrist- worn devices (i.e. smart watches) may not be used by athletes on the firing line.
 8. Rule 6.7.4.4 – PA Mobile phones or other hand-held communication devices (i. e. tablets, etc.), electronic devices or wrist-worn devices (i. e. smart watches) may be used as timers and must be inactive (i.e. flight mode or no SIM card, wi-fi and Bluetooth disabled) so that no disturbance can be caused to others.

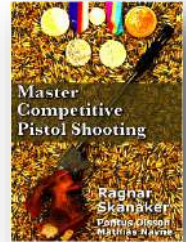

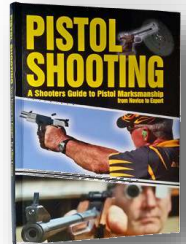

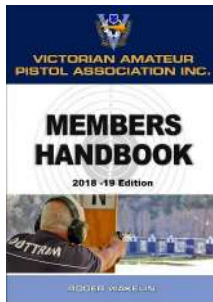
