# VAPA Management Matters

VAPA President Bob Maddocks

The biggest news over the past few months is what Victoria is going to do about Firearm Legislation. The State government has implemented a Rapid Review Report into what changes if any need to be done to the Firearms Act of 1996. Ken Lay ( Former Chief Commissioner of Police) was put in charge of the review. He is to report back at the end of February.

In January, I had a face-to-face meeting with Ken Lay to put our submission regarding changes etc to the legislation. Every shooting association also had either face to face or zoom meetings to put their submissions to the state government.

I advised Ken Lay that pistol shooting in Victoria was the most govern sport in the country, it is set out in the Act, how we join a club, how we apply for a license, how we apply for a handgun and then the Act tells us the minimum time we have to shoot per year depending on the category of the handgun. Clubs then have to submit each year a list of their

members and what they shot that year, if we do not comply with the law then our handgun and or licenses can be confiscated. I also pointed out that limiting the number of handguns is an issue, we have a total of 54 Matches listed by LRD we can compete in, in WA 1500 there are 9 matches involving revolvers and semi auto's. If members shoot in TPA matches and ISSF they can have between 14 and 20 handguns in their possession. Also under the law police have the right to inspect safe keeping facilities in a members home at any reasonable time, and only members have a key or access to the safe. Our main concern was the State Government lumbering all firearm holders under the same roof.

I pointed out our sport has been in existence in Victoria since 1956 and our members have competed in Nationals, Olympic, Commonwealth Games and World Championships. This is a sport like any other sport except our equipment is a pistol not a bat or football.

Many clubs and individual members have also used the government portal to submit their own submissions. VAPA was also a party to a joint statement, sent to Ken Lay, by 9 organizations in shooting, with a combined membership of 70,000.

Target Pistol Australia and Shooting Australia have also put in submissions to the Federal Government and the Institute of Sport, they are still in talks, even though some legislation has been passed. At least 3 State and Territories have stated they will not be part of the Federal Governments buy back scheme. I will keep everyone informed as soon as I hear back from either Ken Lay or the State Government.

We started off the year with a new kind of Open at MISC in January, this was a Mini Open, a one day affair. Over 80 entries were received and again Paul Eskaf and the team at MISC ran a well organized event. Shooters were asked on the line to help with the patching and changing targets, no one said no and it helped the flow of

the event. This was followed a few weeks later by Castlemaine's Open, the weather as usual was hot, but it was a good turnout, catering was excellent and everyone had a good time. Some good scores were shot at both events.

In early March we held the first of our State Titles, ISFF at MISC. Today I have been told there were over 140 entries, which is great, and MISC put on another excellent event.

The sub committee at Yarra have met a few times this year putting final touches to the TPA Nationals again in March. The Victorian Teams have been announced and we wish them all the best. If you have never been to a Nations please come along, it will be held between the 20th and 29th March at the Yarra Pistol Club. Entries have closed and 100 entries have been submitted.

Shooting Australia has just announced the selection of the 2026 National Squad, there were 45 Athletes selected across Pistol, Rifle and

Shotgun. Nine Pistol shooting athletes were named and Talia Woodroffe was one of them. Congratulations to everyone selected, click on the link to see all who have been selected News - Australian International Shooting Ltd

As part of my other role as a Director of Shooting Australia, I will be traveling to Sydney between the 20th and 23rd February for the Shooting Australia's Sydney Cup 1, this event is for both Rifle and Pistol. I will give a full report in the next VPN. I have also attached my international report I submit to The Shooting Sports Council of Victoria; this lists the international events our National Team enter and their results.

The Victorian Firearms Consultative Committee is meeting next month

where we will be asked our thoughts on license holders being able to purchase Silencers, at present only professional shooters can have one. There is no other legislation on the books at the present moment.

Again, I will inform clubs what is happening regards to the Rapid Firearms Review.

# VAPA Position Vacancy Open

Medallion Secretary– Needs to be filled!

This post arranges the purchase of the State Championship and Postal Finals medals (purchased through Cash's in Frankston 3 year supply each time), the State Championship competitor badges, the State Champion plaques and the perpetual shields (purchased through Lega in Nunawading each year).

It also involves the engraving of all of the above. This is done on the VAPA computerised engraving machine (Roland EGX-350 desk top engraver). State Championships are in March (ISSF), August (Action Pistol), September (WA1500), October (Black Powder) and November (Service and WA1500). Postals are held in August.

A form is sent to the organising secretary of the club hosting the State Championships prior to the closing date. This form lists the matches and the grades; with an x to be inserted into each box for the medals required and also asks for the number of competitors for the competitor badge. A minimum of 2 weeks is required to allow time to do all the engraving and

be able to get the medals etc to the host club. This includes any perpetuals that you may have that are not with the recipient from the previous year.

For the Postals the host club for each of the Finals needs to be contacted to ascertain if all matches are being contested.

There is a laptop that goes with the engraver, each of the events have a folder within the engraving program with all the parameters set up for each of the medals badgers etc required. The only changes that need to be made are the year and the grade.

There are 2 cutters used for engraving, one is a diamond cutter for the medals and badgers and the other is used for the plastic plates on the Championship plaques and the perpetual shields (this one must rotate and is turned on and off from the engravers control panel).

Along with all of the above I have a spread sheet that lists all the above events with the winners the year and the score for reference purposes.

This may sound a bit daunting however once you have seen how it is done it will be much clearer and more readily understood.

The time required to do the medals and trophies varies, depending on the number of entries. The longest is the VAPA ISSF State Titles, which takes a total of 10hrs to complete. The other State Titles, Postals and Opens is around 3 hours.

Peter Davis has stated he is more than willing to show anyone who takes on this role how it works and what is

required.

This is an important role we need to fill and the VAPA executive is willing to sit down and talk with potential members willing to take on this role, and discuss possible remuneration.

# SSCV International Report

Bob Maddocks– President

There have been a number of international events since my last report, where Australia has done very well. They include ISSF World Cup Final in December 2025, at Doha, Qatar. This event is by invitation only, based on performance throughout 2025. Jack Rossiter, Penny Smith and Laetisha Scanlan were invited.

The 2026 Air Gun Tour was a development opportunity, which offered 10 Australian athletes (7 rifle and 3 pistol athletes) a chance to gain valuable experience in international competitions in Slovenia, Austria and Germany. After arriving in Europe, the Australian Team split into two groups, with one attending the ISSF Grand Prix Ruse in Slovenia and the other attending the T9F competition in Innsbruck, Austria. The full team then reconvened in Munich, Germany to compete in the H&N Cup (with a field of over 700 competitors) to round out their tour.

In January, 10 Australian para shooting athletes took part in a week-long training camp at the Brisbane

International Shooting Centre. The camp brought together pistol and rifle athletes from varying stages of development, including talent transfer athletes familiar with high-performance systems in other sports, developing athletes progressing from grassroots to high performance, and an experienced cohort of internationally competitive para shooting athletes.

Our biggest concern is what impact the new firearm regulations across Australia will have on our sport.

### **How to make a report**

You can report allegations of reportable conduct against a child or young person by a worker or volunteer by using the Social Services Regulator's webform. The webform will be accessible via their website. Any existing reports made to the Commission before Monday 23 February have been transferred to the Social Services Regulator. You do not need to make another report. If you are concerned that an organisation may not be complying with the Child Safe Standards, you will need to contact the Social Services Regulator.

### **Guidance materials and resources**

In the short term, the Commission will continue to host guidance materials and resources on our website for both the Child Safe Standards and Reportable Conduct Scheme. All regulatory-related information published on the Commission website remains current and applicable to organisations subject to the Standards and Scheme.

### **Our ongoing focus**

The Commission's critical oversight and monitoring functions will continue and our focus remains on promoting the rights, safety, and wellbeing of children in Victoria. We will continue to provide independent scrutiny of service systems, including child protection, out-of-home care, and youth justice, and promote improvements in policies and practices that affect Victorian children and young people. This includes: promoting the interests of children and young people, with a focus on Aboriginal children and young people, and children and young people in the in out-of-home care, child protection and youth justice systems putting children at the centre of our work and ensuring their voices are heard undertaking inquiries into services provided to children, systemic issues and into the deaths of children who are known to child protection advocating for children and young people, including for individual children in the care or child protection systems providing advice and recommendations to Government on improving system responses that promote child safety and wellbeing.

Children's safety will remain an important focus of the Commission's work.

# 2026 VAPA State Coaching Council Situation Report

This report is intended to update VAPA members, coaches and the new members of the TPA Pathways Committee an awareness of the coaching activities been conducted in Victoria by the VAPA State Coaching Council.

We have identified that there is a significant missing link within the development of our athletes; the emerging athlete is basically left to fend for themselves; our current approach and resources are focusing on this level.

In the VAPA Executive's recent Athlete Financial Support Policy we defined "emerging" athletes as a VAPA state team/squad member who is working towards National team selection, while an "elite" athlete was defined as a VAPA member who has been selected for a current National team. Without support to the group of emerging athletes the pool of elite athletes dwindles and weakens. Support to the emerging level athletes may just provide the right tool at the right time to someone who otherwise may just disappear into the group of average shooters and we have missed an opportunity.

There are many areas of Coaching that VAPA has and is providing resources for:

- Guest Coaches
- Financial support
- Weekend Coaching Camps for state team/ squads
- SCATT
- Sports Psychology
- Journals
- Strength and Conditioning
- Reviewing and updating the Level 1 coaching course
- ISSF Level D

These resources are coming at a significant cost to VAPA and it is our hope that when the TPA Pathways Committee is fully established it maybe able to contribute to these initiatives, with the prospect of also building on these programs from a National perspective.

It is our firm view that the only way to increase the performance levels of Australian pistol shooters internationally, is to have very high-quality competition domestically at our State Team Level. A higher level of competition here will provide two things; one— more competition will push

scores higher, and two - shooters will get more used to higher pressure competitions, which will help them perform in international competitions.

## **Guest Coaches**

In 2022 and 2023 VAPA spent significant funds to bring World Champion Rob Vadasz to Victoria. Rob was able to provide coaching to multiple disciplines: WA1500, Service Matches and Action Match, as well as a coach the coach day. Due to the success of the 2022 visit, PSQ aligned with VAPA for the 2023 Rob Vadasz 'tour'. VAPA has created booklets of technique and drills from Rob's content which are available to our State Team members of these disciplines. It is worthy to note, that the now defunct NCC were consulted on this project but chose not to be involved.

2025 ISSF – at the very end of the NCC, funding was gained for Mike Gusitinaino (WAPA) to come to our Nov 25 ISSF coaching weekend. NCC funded his travel and accommodation.

## **Financial**

In addition to funding all these initiatives listed, VAPA has also created a Policy to provide a small, but often necessary, funding for our "emerging" and "elite"

athletes.

## **Weekend Coaching – State Teams/ Squads**

For the past few years, we have been providing coaching weekends for our state teams and squad members twice per year. Often these weekends provide generic sessions that support all of our disciplines.

## **SCATT**

VAPA has purchased a SCATT which will be used at ISSF state coaching weekends, and on a weekly basis with Annette Woodward OLY, who volunteers a weekly coaching session with many of our ISSF State team and squad members. The SCATT will also be used at level 1 coaching courses to show how this technology can assist coaches. A VAPA SCATT diagnosis document has been developed by SCC members and other contributors; this is a living document, in that as the SCC member's knowledge increases the document will be updated and further developed. The document can be accessed by contacting the SCC Director.



# 2026 VAPA State Coaching Council Situation Report– cont'd

## Sports Psychology

VAPA has provided sports psychology group sessions to our state team members, of all disciplines, over the past few years through clinicians from the Mind Rom. These have included sessions on:

- Performance Mindset
- How to Goal Get
- A 6 week Mental Conditioning course delivered to a group of 20 athletes.

This year we are providing an extensive individual-based program over 10 months, which covers individual sessions (individuals contribute financially) and attendance by the Sport Psychologist at coaching and competition weekends. By approving this program for our State Team Members (open to all disciplines) VAPA has shown it's understanding that to have recognisable results at an elite international level the investment into athlete development needs to start at the "emerging" athlete level, with the direct the byproduct of that being a higher performing state team. The Sports Psychology program we are investing in is coming from the knowledge that shooting sports are very

mentally demanding; we know that performing in competition has been a failure point for some of our athletes and we are trying to providing tools and resources to them now, as an emerging athlete, rather than let them fail or let them flounder for years.

We will be conducting a pre and post questionnaire as one way to assess this program's effectiveness.

## Precision Shot Pro ISSF Journal

The 2026 ISSF team will be provided with the Gen 2 Precision Shot Pro ISSF journal, this underpins the planning and structured training that we have focused on last year and continue to focus on this year.

## Strength and Conditioning Programs

In January 2026, the SCC commissioned a Personal Trainer, with shooting experience, to create a suite of generic programs for Strength and conditioning specific for pistol shooting:

- Grip Strength
- Range Warm up
- Strength and conditioning- 3 programs with a work out log.

These programs will be available for State team members, all disciplines, and it will also become an additional tool for

VAPA Level 1 coaches.

## **Reviewing and updating the Level 1 coaching course**

The SCC committee members have identified that the current Level 1 coaching course needs updating and reviewing. There are additional areas that the SCC would like to include, such as a module to cover two handed shooting to support our other non ISSF disciplines.

The SCC is hoping to run two coaching courses in 2026.

## **ISSF Level D**

In 2025 VAPA sponsored two coaches to complete the ISSF Academy Level D coaching course. This has become a basis and standard for our review of the Level 1 course.

In 2026, two more coaches are completing the course, with the prospect of one progressing to Level C.

VAPA held a State Team coaching weekend in February '26 at the Melbourne International Shooting Club where several of our state team members were treated to a variety of coaching opportunities including 10M Air Pistol coaching and pressure shoot offs with state team coach Annette Woodward, as well as a simulated Finals match, 25M rapid fire/dueling and precision drills on the 25M range across the weekend which was highlighted by a unique opportunity to work with The Mind Room Sports Psychologist.

Lee Marshall from The Mind Room took the athletes through a workshop focused on sports psychology training looking at high performance situations

and how our emotions affect our shooting and provided insights how to 'tame the inner critic'.

VAPA provided each athlete with a copy of the Precision Shot Pro Journal which aligned with the Mind Room focus on training, recording, reflection and planning your training sessions specifically for competition vs 'just training'.

It was a hugely successful event that everyone enjoyed with a great deal of team collaboration, sharing of personal insights, methods and ideas to round out the weekend.

Huge thanks to State Team Manager, Cherie Blake, for her endless hard work making these events happen.



# Norfolk Island Pistol Champs

Neil Stewart– Melton Pistol Club

I have seen the advertisements for the Norfolk Island Pistol Championships in the PA Bulletin, and more recently as Secretary of Melton Pistol Club and the championships had been on my “Bucket List” for a number of years. Finally, in 2025 I decided to “Bite the Bullet” and attend the Championships. What an adventure it turned out to be!

Norfolk Island is an Australian External Territory. Australian Citizens do not need a passport to travel to Norfolk Island, though it is recommended and flights from Australia depart from the International Terminals at Sydney and Brisbane. You also have to apply for a Restricted Goods Export Permit to take Firearms out of Australia and a B709 to import them to Norfolk Island. You then need to complete a Restricted Goods Export Permit to get your firearms out of Norfolk Island. Luckily I had a couple of good advisors in Linda Ryan and Cherrie Blake to help me complete the paperwork and it was all

approved.

As my flight was scheduled to depart Sydney at 9.55 am on Friday, I flew to Sydney on Thursday. Next morning woke early and proceeded to the Australian Border Force office to get my Firearms and ammunition checked. The officer took me into a room and I opened my gun case and handed each firearm to the officer to check. One advantage of travelling “internationally” with firearms is that a Border Force Officer escorts you to Check In and you go to the front of the queue, then the Border Force Officer escorts you to Special Baggage to make sure your firearms have been sent down the conveyor belt to the luggage area of the airport. Went through Immigration Control and to the Qantas Lounge for

Our plane wasn't at a gate and we had to catch a bus to the plane when I saw Len Creek and John Ingold from NSW, so at least I knew someone else that was competing.

Settled down for a 2.5 hour flight, then about an

hour into the flight, the pilot announced we would be returning to Sydney as the plane had a "maintenance issue" and there were no maintenance facilities on Norfolk. Landed back in Sydney about noon and Qantas could not really tell us anything except to keep an eye on the departure boards and listen for announcements for an updated departure time. By this time I had also met Jason & Kaye Norris and John Stokes from NSW who were also competing in the event. Eventually Qantas decided to cancel the flight and reschedule it for Saturday. Qantas put most of the shooters in the same hotel for the night, so it was good to have some company.



The flight was scheduled for noon on Saturday so we didn't have to get up quite so early. Arrived at the airport and went to the special Qantas Norfolk Island check in desk, only to be informed that we would have to go to Border Force again for them to check the firearms. This was in spite of the gun cases still having the "Qantas Yellow Tape" on them from yesterday! Not so lucky this time, the officer told me to remove the padlocks from my gun case and took the case away to check the firearms. I was later called into the room to "Make sure they had repacked them properly". Again we got a Border Force Officer to escort us through check in process.



# Norfolk Island Pistol Champs

Boarded the plane, (it was a different one from yesterday) and eventually made it to Norfolk Island, arriving about 3.45 pm, just before the scheduled Brisbane to Norfolk Island flight arrived. Was met on arrival by Doug Creek, Organising Secretary of the Championships and a Norfolk Island Police Officer at customs and he smoothed the whole process through. Firearms were taken to the armoury by Kevin Coulter and Doug mentioned that we had about 90 minutes to get to the welcoming “Fish Fry” at the Club!

My tour package included accommodation, transport to the accommodation and a hire car, which was at my accommodation. Caught the bus to my accommodation, was shown to my room and my hire car. Armed with only the map that came with the hire car I tried to find the Pistol Club. I had been warned about driving on Norfolk. Livestock have Right of Way, the “Norfolk Wave” and how rough the roads were. If you hit any livestock, you must make a report to the police and a vet. Luckily I didn’t hit any livestock,

though I did have to slow down from livestock many times over the week and you need to keep an eye out for cow pats on the roads. The “Norfolk Wave” is an acknowledgement to oncoming drivers which is almost mandatory on Norfolk. As for the roads, most of them, outside of towns, are like driving on cobblestones! Speed limits are 40 km/h in towns and 50 km/h outside of towns; I don’t think I exceeded 30 km/h all the way to the Pistol Club.

Couldn't really work out the Duty Free status of Norfolk Island. Beer was about the same price as Australia, spirits and cigarettes were much cheaper. Heard an ad on the radio on the day I was leaving for a "One Day only sale at the Bond Store". Jim Beam 1125 ml bottle on special for \$29.00, saving of \$9.00, meaning the regular price was \$38. Much cheaper than Australia!

On the entry form, competitors were asked to bring two bricks of .22 ammo and the club would buy any unused ammo from them. Doug mentioned that the club bought a case of CCI ammo from a dealer in Queensland for about \$750, but the airfreight was an additional \$1100.00. They also purchased a case of .22 ammo from New Zealand for about the same price, yet sea freight added another \$800.00. Everything shipped to Norfolk means shipping costs and it is cheaper to buy unused ammo from the competitors than to pay for the shipping!

On departure, firearms were delivered to the airport from the armoury and Border Force just had to check that the seal numbers on the RPG matched the

seal numbers on the case. Again all competitors were escorted by Border Force to the front of the queue.

Our flight departed and arrived on schedule. We then had to wait about an hour on the tarmac for our gate to become available. I thought I had planned my flights to allow plenty of time to make my connection to Melbourne, arriving in Sydney about 4.00 pm and departing around 7.30 pm. No problems at customs coming back to Australia, it just took time to check the firearms and the relevant documentation. Switched my phone out of flight mode and there was a message from Qantas that my 7.30 pm flight had been cancelled and I would be on the 8.00 pm flight. About 30 minutes later there was another message from Qantas that the 8.00 pm flight had also been cancelled and I had been scheduled on the 6.30 am flight on Saturday! Another night in Sydney at Qantas' expense! As anyone who has travelled with firearms knows that you have to be at the airport at least three hours before the flight to check in, there was no way known I was getting to the airport at 3.30 am!

Eventually negotiated a flight at 11.30 am on Saturday. As it turned out, I got stuck behind a Rock Band travelling with all their gear at check in, taking up the three available check in agents and it took about an hour to complete check in on Saturday.

Norfolk Island is an oasis in the Pacific Ocean, but I didn't get time to see it all. Managed to get to the Captain Cook Memorial on the north side of the Island, commemorating Captain Cook's landing in the Island. Had to drive on some unsealed roads to get there and the unsealed roads were smoother than the sealed roads! The same day I tried to go to Mt Pitt, but the road was closed for resealing. Managed to get to the top of Mt Pitt the next day, what

a magnificent view! From the top of Mt Pitt you have 360 degrees view of the island and surrounding islands. Didn't get to see the historic Penal area of Kingston or any

of the southern part of the Island, will explore this in 2026. Norfolk Island is only approx 35 square kilometres and there is about 80 kilometres of roads.

Was talking to Shane Profitt, a local NIPA Member and a drone pilot and he said that all drones on the island have to be registered by the aviation authorities, as the entire Island is within a 5.5 km radius of the airport.

The weather during my trip was magnificent. Overnight lows of about 18 degrees with maximum temps during the day of around 26 degrees and there were only a couple of light showers during my stay.

## **A few tips from my experience.**

Qantas is the only airline that flies to Norfolk. Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday from Brisbane. Wednesday, Friday and Sunday from Sydney. As the flights depart relatively early (10.00 am from Sydney and 11.30 am from Brisbane), would suggest you fly to Sydney or Brisbane the day before to allow for Border Force inspections of your firearms at the port of departure.

There is no roaming agreement for Australian Mobile phones on Norfolk. You either have to purchase a local SIM, or do as I did and remain incommunicado for your visit. Free Wi-Fi is available at most accommodation and many Clubs, restaurants and cafes on the Island so you can use various messaging apps on your phone to keep in touch with home.

Try to book your accommodation and car hire independently and not through a Travel Agent.

Many Travel Agents include various Tours and entry to the Islands attractions, most of which are scheduled

at a time you will most likely be shooting. I had several included in my package and only used the bus to and from the airport! Look for car hire companies that offer pick up and return to the airport. Most hire car companies will leave your car at your accommodation as part of a deal.

Have already booked my accommodation for the 2026 Championships, with a couple of extra days to take some tours and explore the rest of the Island.

I would encourage any VAPA Members who might be considering a “Bucket List” competition to attend to look at the Norfolk Island Pistol Championships. It was a very friendly, laid back and well organised competition. The Club Members make the new competitors feel welcome, as do the returning competitors. The 2027 Norfolk Island Pistol Championships will be the 25th Anniversary Championships.

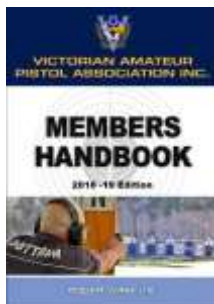
