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VAPA Management Matters

VAPA President Bob Maddocks

First and foremost, I want to thank the members of VAPA, who voted for my Honorary Life Membership at the VAPA AGM in July. I am truly honored to receive this precious award; I have been in this sport since 1969 and I love it. Thank you again, I will wear the badge with pride.

Since my last report there has been a dramatic change in Target Pistol Australia, the Treasurer, Kerry -Ann Crlik and the Sport Administrator, Noel Harrod, have both resigned from the board. Only Paul Steen, First Vice President and Linda Ryan, Second Vice President remain from last year's board.

We have already seen changes with the newly elected President. In June, two new Funding / Athlete Support programs were announced for ISSF and WSPS athletes.

The first initiative is the TPA Athlete ISSF Scholarship Fund, which has been established to support developing athletes who are consistently performing at A Grade

level or higher in their chosen event or events. The purpose of this Scholarship is to help athletes manage the financial demands of training, competition and development, and to encourage continued progression within the sport in the lead-up to 2032.

The second initiative is the TPA Funding Guidelines for International ISSF/WSPS Athlete Support. This program is designed to assist eligible TPA members selected by Shooting Australia as non-funded or partially funded members of an Australian international team competing at ISSF or WSPS events where Olympic or Paralympic quota places may be secured, and/or Minimum Qualifying Scores may be achieved. The first recipients of the funding were announced last month. Please see TPA website for more details and were to apply for the funding.

The 2026 Postals are now finished, I have the pennants for the division winners which I will distribute at the September COM meeting. It is a shame that only Black Powder and WA1500 finals will be run this year, ISSF and Service will not be held as no club put up their hand to run them.

We have also this year found it hard to get Clubs to hold our State Titles, even though we have had a dramatic increase in membership, there has been a decline in participation in ISSF, Action Match, Service and Metallic matches. To that end VAPA has set up a new sub committee to look into the reasons why this is and see what clubs need us to do to increase support for our sport in the future.

We have already sent out a survey to all clubs, a number of clubs have replied and after the September COM meeting the committee will look at the replies and see what needs to be done. I have included the survey in this newsletter and I am asking all our members to put in their ideas, of what needs to be done from their side.

Finally, we held our first meeting for 2026 of the Victorian Firearm Consultative Committee, it was a zoom meeting. We were given a report on the new legislation drawn up after the Ken Lay Rapid Review report was handed down. The new legislation only deals with the Chief Commissioner, gaining more power to classify firearms in the future as new technology comes in. There are also new penalties coming in to cover the illegal handling of 10 or more firearms. There will also be new rules regarding citizenship qualifications for obtaining a firearm licence, these include police using Auscheck to determine citizenship status. It is interesting to note that LRD and Police have stated they do not have the resources or the funding to do these checks, as well as do the public applying for the licence, have to pay increase fees to run these checks.

There is not time line when this legislation will be passed in parliament and when it will be enacted.

We also have an election in November and whoever gets in there may be more changes to come.

One thing we do know is there will be no cap on firearms and no buy back of existing firearms.

Both sub committee for the 2027 ISSF Nationals at MISC and the WA1500 World Championships, also in 2027 are well underway. Both clubs will

be asking for support from, range officers, scorers and helpers on the range, so please if you want to help contact both clubs and let them know or you can email myself and I will pass it on.

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VAPA Club Survey

VAPA has established a focused sub-committee to tackle the core barriers that are currently limiting clubs' ability to run and host Opens, state titles, and postal finals. This work also extends to understanding and potentially addressing the declining participation in the postal competition.

The sub-committee's mandate is to identify root causes, engage directly with clubs across the state, and develop practical and sustainable solutions state and potentially nationwide. Its purpose is to ensure that the sports' competitive pathway remains accessible, resilient, and future proof, with clubs feeling supported, confident and equipped to host events.

VAPA needs your support, we are asking you to reply to the questions in this survey, talk to your committee and members to get their views. We cannot support you if we do not know what support or help you need. If we do not have competitions then there is no sport of pistol shooting.

Please reply by the 25th September.

Key Areas of Focus:

- Event Hosting Challenges - Understanding why clubs struggle to host opens, state titles, and postal finals including resource limitations, volunteer shortages, scheduling/ squadding pressures etc.
- Operational Barriers - Reviewing administrative, financial, and logistical hurdles that prevent clubs from confidently taking on major events.
- Postal Competition Participation - Investigating why some clubs are not entering the postal competition, whether due to awareness, workload, perceived complexity, or lack of member engagement.
- Support Structures - Identifying what assistance (training, financial, documents, templates, recourses, mentoring etc.) VAPA can provide to make hosting easier and more attractive.

To support the work of the sub-committee, VAPA is asking all clubs to respond to the following questions as honestly and as thoroughly as possible. Your feedback is vital in helping us understand the fundamental barriers currently impacting clubs. While many of the underlying concerns may seem obvious at face value, it is essential that every club is given a genuine opportunity to express it's views. Your insights ensure that decisions moving forward are informed, representative, and grounded in the real experiences of our clubs.

Questions -

1. Does your club currently host events? If so, which disciplines? If not, has your club ever run them or are thinking about running them? If so, which disciplines?
2. What are the biggest barriers currently either preventing your club from hosting events (e.g. volunteers, facilities, finances etc.), or proving to be a significant issue if you are currently hosting them?
3. How well equipped do you feel your club is to take on an event, and what specific gaps or risks concern you the most?
4. How would you describe your club's volunteer base in terms of experience, percentage to membership base and percentage or quantity of qualified ROs etc.?
5. Does your club actively compete in the postal competition? If not, please explain the reasons why?
6. What specific forms of support including from VAPA would make your club more confident and willing to host events?
7. If the main barriers you have listed are addressed, how likely would your club be to host a major event in the next 1 - 3 years, and what type of event(s) would you realistically consider? Is the idea of a Mini Open with a condensed program held over one day of interest to you?
8. How many members do you have?
9. Are there any other issues, ideas, or suggestions you wish to share?

Life Membership– Howard Reed

It is with great pleasure Mildura Pistol Club accepts Howard Reed for Life Membership of the Mildura Pistol Club in recognition of his outstanding service, commitment and contribution to the Club over more than three decades. Howard first visited the Mildura Pistol Club following the 1990 Commonwealth Games in New Zealand and officially joined the Club in August 1990. From that time, he became a regular and dedicated member, contributing not only as a competitive shooter but also as a leader, volunteer, instructor and administrator. As a competitor, Howard initially participated in ISSF disciplines before expanding into Service Pistol, Metallic Silhouette, Black Powder and other shooting disciplines. Throughout his shooting career he has achieved numerous Open, State and National titles across a variety of events. He has proudly represented Mildura Pistol Club at Three-Way Shoots, Victorian Action Championships and National Championships, demonstrating both skill and sportsmanship while

promoting the Club at the highest levels. Howard's commitment to the Club has extended far beyond competition. Shortly after joining, he volunteered to help lay the bricks in the clubhouse and assisted in constructing the Club's trophy cabinet. This marked the beginning of an extraordinary commitment to maintaining and improving the Club's facilities that continues to this day.



Over many years Howard has been instrumental in numerous range improvement projects, including:

- Construction of much of the seating at the rear of the shooting bays
- Installation of gutters and much of the verandah
- Concrete works around the ranges and score shed
- Construction of walls on Ranges 1 and 4
- Installation of the toilet ceilings
- Assisting Ian Thompson and Don Andrews in building the Club's original air range
- Designing and implementing target modifications, including major upgrades to the plate range prior to the 2004 Victorian State Titles and subsequent National Championships, with assistance from Les Moncrieff
- Taking a leading role in the building of the current air shed

These improvements have provided lasting benefits to both members and visitors and continue to serve the Club today. Howard has also given countless hours of service through Club administration. He has served multiple terms as President, Treasurer, Chief Range Officer and General Committee member, always

placing the interests of the Club ahead of his own. His willingness to accept responsibility and provide strong leadership has been invaluable to the continued success of the Mildura Pistol Club. Howard has also made a significant contribution to firearms safety and education. As one of the Club's qualified Action Range Officers, he has played an important role in ensuring competitions are conducted safely and professionally. TPA Athlete ISSF Scholarship

Target Pistol Australia

On behalf of the Target Pistol Australia Board and TPA National Council, I am pleased to advise members of the formalisation of two athlete support initiatives designed to assist our developing and internationally aspiring ISSF and WSPS athletes. These initiatives reinforce TPA's commitment to nurturing the next generation of athletes who aspire to represent Australia at Olympic and Paralympic level, ensuring our sport continues to have a strong presence on the world's most prestigious sporting stage.

The first initiative is the TPA Athlete ISSF Scholarship Fund, which has been established to support developing athletes who are consistently performing at A Grade level or higher in their chosen event or events. The purpose of this Scholarship is to help athletes manage the financial demands of training, competition and development, and to encourage continued progression within the

sport in the lead-up to 2032.

The Scholarship Fund is intended to provide practical assistance towards costs such as competition entry fees, travel and accommodation for coaching and competitions, equipment or maintenance, and training or coaching expenses. Scholarships will be offered twice each calendar year, with one round announced at the ISSF National Championships and a second round in November. Funding allocations will be subject to the annual budget, the number of applications received, and the strength of those applications. To be considered, athletes must be current financial members of a TPA-affiliated club, actively compete in TPA-sanctioned competitions, regularly achieving A Grade standard scores in recognised competitions, demonstrate a strong commitment to ongoing training and competition, and represent the sport in a professional and positive manner.

Applications will be assessed against published criteria, including

consistency and standard of performance, commitment to the sport, future development potential, and contribution to the positive representation of Target Pistol Australia.

The second initiative is the TPA Funding Guidelines for International ISSF/WSPS Athlete Support. This program is designed to assist eligible TPA members selected by Shooting Australia as non-funded or partially funded members of an Australian international team competing at ISSF or WSPS events where Olympic or Paralympic quota places may be secured, and/or Minimum Qualifying Scores may be achieved.

Subject to approval and budget availability, TPA may contribute up to 75% of approved self-funded costs for eligible international events, including airfares, accommodation, ground transport and competition entry fees. Athletes seeking this support must show a clear commitment to training and competition, regularly compete at TPA and Shooting Australia-

sanctioned events, demonstrate measurable performance progression, and submit a post-competition report to TPA after returning from the event.

These initiatives reflect TPA's commitment to supporting athlete development in a responsible, transparent, and sustainable manner. They acknowledge both the dedication required of athletes pursuing international success and the importance of maintaining a strong Australian presence at ISSF and WSPS competitions, World Championships and ultimately the Olympic and Paralympic Games. These programs are designed to supplement athlete costs; they are not intended to fully fund participation. All funding decisions will remain subject to eligibility, assessment outcomes, available budget and the broader interests of the sport.

Spotting Scope

The digital eyepiece can be used on most spotting scopes, no need to buy a new one in most cases provided the lense is big enough for the ratchet to engage (Approx 30mm-56mm) .

I have used the eyepiece on multiple scopes, however I recently upgraded to the Celestron Hummingbird 9-27x56 for its size and increased quality over others I have had (\$150-400 depending where you buy).



Digital Eyepiece

The digital eyepiece is a SVBony SC002, SVBony produces a range of scopes and telescopes and this is one of their accessories. Can be purchased for \$100-160 depending on wait time and availability online.

The eyepiece has its own resolution and optical zoom settings, and can transmit to two devices at a time. It comes with its own software for the device(s) you are transmitting to. It has an internal memory card and also can save to the device you are using.





Spotting Scope Accessories

Chris Driver

Tablet/Device

I am using the smallest and cheapest tablet I could get from JBHI-FI, 8.7" ~\$250 it is as simple and basic as they come with no SIM card etc, and only 2 applications on it. The application for the SC002, and a Clock/Stopwatch/Timer which I run on a split screen on the line with the shot camera taking 75% of the screen and the timer on the other 25%. The Digital Eyepiece is connected via a wireless WIFI connection with the tablet with no external internet connection.

A mobile phone or many other devices are able to be used with the eyepiece however it can present issues on the line so when using it myself and not as a training aid the tablet arrangement is used.

I tried a few devices prior to this setup and was not really happy with any of them quality and clarity wise, this arrangement is by far the best and the clarity/quality is as close as I can get to training on electrics while hiding out in far west NSW without breaking



the bank (all in ~\$500 including buying a scope). Can extremely clearly zoom into the 8 ring at 25m and 50m with one touch returning the screen to a full target view should there be a shot not where it should be.

Hopefully this can help out others, please let me know if any other information is required.

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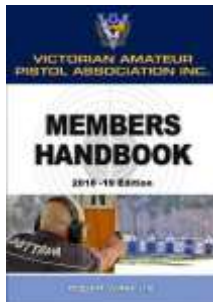
